

# Father Joe's Notes



My dear friends,

Last weekend, we paused on the twentieth anniversary of the terrorist attacks in our nation to honor those who died and comfort those who lost loved ones. Oddly, 20 years ago, September Eleventh was just the birthday of my college roommate and my niece, Evelyn. It went from being a day of joy and celebration to being somber. Despite that, I still always take time that day to call each of them and laugh and celebrate their presence in my life. The pain

of the attacks doesn't change a lifetime of laughter and joy. There is still cause to rejoice.

They were married 34 years ago this day down in both at the same time, and it is OK. Baltimore. I remember having to head back home from college just a few weeks into my sophomore year. We formed a caravan of cars in the family to go down and celebrate that marriage. Despite some horrible issues with hotels that we laugh about today, it was great. This weekend should be a joyous occasion, but it's melancholy at best. My brother in law died a few months ago. It's the first anniversary without him. It causes us to stop and reflect. While there is sadness, there is still joy. We loved Fish and the sadness comes from the loss of one who loved us too. The pain is a result of the joy, but it is the good memories I will cherish. Sadness does not negate the memories or the great times.

Next weekend, we will celebrate the farewell Mass for St. Thomas Church. It seems odd to celebrate a goodbye. There is sadness that a beloved church building of 161 years will be closing the doors forever.

## **¥** Ask Father **¥**

**Question:** Were Adam and Eve real people?

**Answer:** That's complicated. If we were asking whether real historical people lived in specific location on a set date that can be verified by archeological data, the answer would be no. If we were asking whether the story is true, the answer would be yes. Let me try to explain. The Bible is not written as a historical text book trying to impart a timeline of human events. It's a work of faith. Human beings have been inspired by God to use their language and skill to convey the truth of God's love and activity. That story they impart is told from the period of time in which they lived with the knowledge of the day. The truth of God is spoken in this fashion. Did God make the world from nothing? Yes. Did that process of Creation take the time equivalence of 7 solar days? No. But God did create the world and all that forms it over time. That brought about the right environment for humans to live in which we respond to God's loving action. Did a real couple actual live as the only people in a garden in the Middle East? We aren't sure. What we do know is that the story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden tells us how human being sinned in our early history and disrupted the relationship we had with God. That broken relationship led humans to act in sinful, disordered ways that impact the world in which we live. That is Original Sin. There may have been ancient people named Adam and Eve whose memory inspired the tale in Genesis. Is that historically verifiable? No, it isn't. Is the message of their sin and the impact it has on the world true. Absolutely!


