It seems hard to believe that we are coming to the end of two months in which three parishes in town have been linked: Immaculate Conception, St. Thomas, and St. Dominic. I feel as if we were discussing this happening only a few weeks ago, but talks for planning and preparations

have been going on for a few years now. The past year was a time of transition to line things up, and we are still working to get things organized now. The common where we are and where we are going.

We have faced our share of surprises.

Ouestion: Father, someone was telling me that Father Madejski is the pastor of Immaculate Conception, since he is Polish. Is that true?

Answer: No. I am the pastor of Immaculate Conception, St. Thomas, and St. Dominic Parishes. As I prepared to become the pastor of the three parishes. I knew we had a need for Polish language ministry with Masses and Confessions. I approached the Archdiocese of Hartford, and Monsignor Shanley found us Father David Madejski to come here to help serve the parishioners. Since he does speak Polish, I have assigned him to preside at the Sunday Morning Mass in Polish. That doesn't mean he is pastor there any more than he would be pastor of the 7:30AM people, if I assigned him regularly to that Mass. The pastor is the priest who is ultimately responsible for all aspects of ministry in a parish. Pastors are the head of the parish corporation, signing checks The pastor ensures all things are done and contracts. according to Canon Law, legal laws, and meet the policies and procedures of the diocese. The pastor is one responsible for all elements of the operation of a parish. Those are my duties for all the parishes, even if you don't see me presiding at every Mass. That does not mean the pastor works alone in this. Various people are delegated to handle certain aspects, like business managers who pay the bills, balance the books, and make the financial reports; nevertheless, the pastor needs to review these regularly. Father Madejski is the Parochial Vicar. That is his assignment. I am the pastor.
