


Father Joe's Notes

★ Ask Father **★**

Question: Father, Last weekend we heard a Gospel passage condemning divorce. Why?

Answer: Well, we don't control what passages are read. The readings for Sunday Liturgies are all found in the Lectionary, and they are organized in the cycles covering three years in which we hear most all of the Bible read at Mass. That is why we read that passage. Why does Jesus condemn divorce? Well, because God is love. We see love on earth most fully realized in the love of a married couple. Husband and wife are called to live in a union of affection, respect, and trust. They share in Creation, bringing children to birth and building up home and community. When they live the promises of their vows, we see something of God's love. We do not want to see that relationship break down any more than we want our relationship with God to be ruptured. Since God is merciful and patient, we hope and pray spouses will be too. If couples live like this, there should be no need for divorce. Having said this, we know there are times relationships become toxic and irrevocably damaged. In such cases, it is better for the couple to separate. Does this mean they are condemned and God doesn't love them? No! Jesus came to people where they were, most often when their lives were broken and painful. Christ encounters us where we are: single, married, or divorced. We uphold Christ's call for marriage to be sacred and preserved, but we do not condemn or excommunicate the divorced.


Please, contact the rectory if you or a family member is homebound or in the hospital. We can arrange for a Eucharistic Minister to bring you the Blessed Sacrament at home.

The relegation to profane but not sordid use of Saint Thomas Church in Southington

On October 20, 2021, the parish church of Saint Thomas, located at 143 Bristol Street, Southington, Connecticut, will be relegated to profane but not sordid use in accordance with canon 1222 §2 of the Code of Canon Law. On September 28, 2021, Archbishop Leonard P. Blair issued a decree effecting the relegation that St. Thomas Church is no longer a sacred place of worship.

During the weekend of October 2/3, 2021, the decree was read at all Masses, and its substance was communicated to all parishioners by means of display on the doors of the church and rectory. It is also available on the Archdiocese of Hartford website, under News/Public Notices Section, https://archdioceseofhartford.org/public-notices/. Canonical recourse may be made within the peremptory time limit of ten (10) business days from the legitimate notification of the decree and in accordance with the norms of law (c. 1734 §2).
