ASH WEDNESDAY FEBRUARY 17 The Congregation for Divine Worship has released a note laying out the procedures priests around the world are to follow for the distribution of ashes at the start of Lent.

Instructions After blessing the ashes and sprinkling them with holy water in silence, the priest addresses those present, reciting once the formula found in the Roman Missal: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return". At that point, the note continues, the priest "cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places." He then sprinkles the ashes on each person's head "without saying anything."

LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as days of fast, when only one full meal is allowed.

On days of fast two other meatless meals may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.

- 2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
- 3. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at fourteen (14) years of age.
- 4. The obligation to fast begins at eighteen (18) years of age and ends at fifty-nine (59) years of age.

Although the faithful may excuse themselves <u>for a just cause</u> from these laws of fast and abstinence, there is an obligation to <u>substitute another penance</u> and no Catholic should lightly excuse himself/herself from this obligation in the Lenten season.

Mary Warner



Max Skribiski-Banack


