**ABSTINENCE** from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent.



**FASTING** is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this

may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary. Eating of solid food between meals is not permitted.

# the Shephero's Desk

We may know some people who have a passion in their life. This passion is some driving motivation that gives the entirety of their life purpose and meaning. A person who has a passion for baseball for example may watch as many games as possible. They memorize statistics of all the players and track the teams where they get traded. They try to see a major league ballgame in every stadium. They know all the slang and terms of art and acquainted with all the nuances of the rules. They can call a game better than an umpire. With any passion, there's a diminishment in other areas of the person's life like diet, rest, relationships, sense of perspective, forgoing better wages or a better job. All these diminishments are willingly accepted for the sake of their passion.

Jesus had a passion. It was the will of God whom he called his Father. He knew he was chosen by the Father and sent on a mission by the Father to save the human race from the powers of sin and death for the Father. He spoke often of the Father's Kingdom and its life. He demonstrated its presence through the miracles he performed. He called people to follow him and prepared some to be sent to continue the mission of the Father. So great was his passion, that Jesus endured the diminishments of his Passion, namely, his suffering resulting from his trial from false accusations, violent physical torture, psychological abuse from the jeers of the crowd, and abandonment by betrayal and denial culminating in his dying a public execution by being nailed to a cross.

Through his diminishment by his Passion compelled by his passion for the will of the Father, Jesus was able to take onto his body every dysfunctional symptom of sin's power, even the power itself, so that sin's power died when Jesus died. Then, after being buried for three days, the power of life made new by the Father raised Jesus from the dead. Jesus breathed this life through the Holy Spirit upon those he chose to send into the world to continue the Father's passionate mission. The passionate mission of the Father lives with the Risen Christ in the Church with the Holy Spirit.

Members of the Church who are disciples of Jesus have experienced God's passion for them and are compelled to tell others and invite people to a conversion into this renewed life of God that they experienced. When others encounter Jesus and experience the passion, they too become disciples. The cycle continues through time until the mission of Jesus motivated by the passion of the Father is completed by the Church.

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord marks the beginning of the holiest week for many Christians throughout the world. It is a week when many who have a marginal relationship with the Church gather with those who have a stronger relationship to immerse themselves together into the Paschal Mystery. The Paschal Mystery begins with the Passion of Jesus, continues with the Resurrection of Jesus and concludes with the Giving of the Holy Spirit. It is the mystery that compels the Church forward. The Paschal Mystery is the passion of the Church.


