the Shephero's Desk

I would like to extend to all the families and friends in Prince of Peace Parish my blessings in wishing you a Happy Easter. It is my hope that this Easter Sunday marks a positive return from COVID's exile and a positive turn in founding a post-pandemic parish. I also extend the warmest welcome to all who are visiting us this holiest of weekends. I am so delighted that you have responded to the invitation of the Risen Christ to celebrate with us. I hope you will be able to join us for the entire Easter season.

I say Easter season because Easter is not a one-time event. It is a series of events that happened to Jesus and in the experience of the earliest disciples as they encountered the Risen Christ. Because of Jesus, Easter happens to us through the Paschal Mystery. We not only celebrate Easter over the course of a season, we live out Easter over the course of our life in our journey of faith. It gives direction to the mission that is the Church.

Monk and mystic, Thomas Keating, tells us that our journey of faith is not some career path that we follow to success. Rather it is a series of humiliations that lead to something more profound. This series of humiliations is an Easter cycle that is continually repeated in our life.

Spiritual writer, Ronald Rolheiser, describes the Easter cycle in this way. Good Friday happens when there is loss of life, when we lose some part of our life that we will never get back and that we will never be the same because of the loss. Easter Sunday happens when we get new life because of the life we lost. This new life does not restore the old or what was lost, but brings about something new that changes us. Ascension Thursday happens when are finally able to let go, to stop trying to cling to what we lost and let the past bless us. Pentecost happens when we get new spirit to live the life we have already begun.

Similar to the seasons of the year, the experience of Easter is a series of cycles in life that entail dying, rising, ascension, and having the spirit come to us. It may not be regular as the meteorological seasons, but it is just as real.

At every Mass, after we have proclaimed the mystery of faith (We proclaim your Death, O Lord), I say in the Eucharistic Prayer, "Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous resurrection and Ascension into heaven, and as we look forward to his second coming...." This is the summary of the Paschal Mystery and what we celebrate in the Easter Season. It is not just a summary of what we celebrate. It is also a summary of the cycle in Christian life as a living sacrifice to gather people as disciples into the passionate love and life of God. It is the process through which Christ's mission is continually lived out in the Church. It is our alleluia agenda.



"Alleluia!" Christ is Risen! "Alleluia!" With these simple words we proclaim to all the world that death does not have the final word. With these simple words we proclaim our belief in the promise of Jesus Christ that everyone who lives and believes in Him will have eternal life.

Jesus came to deliver this message of hope. It is a message of his self-sacrificing love for us that even conquers death. It is a message that is received and welcomed by some, and rejected by others until the end of time.

Easter is a day of triumph, of great joy and hope, even though we continue to witness the horrific effects of the Russian invasion of Ukraine and the tragedy being inflicted on so many innocent people of all ages, not to mention the many sorrows and sins that are still part of life in this world. But none of these things will ever have the last word. Easter is the definitive message that God has the last word that life will triumph over death, that sorrow and anguish will inevitably give way vindication and joy!

We possess an unshakeable hope because of Jesus Christ. During this Easter Season, as we celebrate the glory of His death and resurrection, let us remember that it offers us hope, and it gives us comfort. It is in response to divine love that we rejoice as brothers and sisters today, no longer scattered and divided by sin, but united as one Body in Christ. As together we renew our baptismal promises and receive the Holy Eucharist, we become living signs of the redemption of the world, as one Body we proclaim the Easter Gospel for the salvation of the world.

Today and every day people across our Archdiocese give of their time, talent and treasure to help others and bring them hope. This gift of self is evident within our Church and throughout the wider community. Thank you for all that you do to build up God's Kingdom.

As we celebrate Easter you are in my prayers, and I ask God's choicest blessings upon you and your loved ones. He is Risen, Alleluia!




