GOSPEL MEDITATION January 16, 2022 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' mother to heart when she says, "Listen to him." This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus. ©LPi

A MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR BOB

What is ORDINARY TIME? Now that the Christmas season is completed, we begin the next liturgical season known as Ordinary Time. Because the term ordinary in English most often means something that is not special or distinctive, many people think that Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. The season of Ordinary Time makes up most of the liturgical year in the Church and is a time for growth and maturation. It is a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into our lives.

Ordinary Time is called ordinary not because it is common but simply because the weeks of this season are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis* which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo* from which we get the English word order. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time in fact represent the ordered life of the Church, the period in which we live our lives neither feasting as we do during Christmas and Easter nor fasting which we do in Advent and Lent. Instead, we gather in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

It is appropriate that we begin this season with the Gospel passage of the wedding feast at Cana where Christ turns water into wine. There is nothing ordinary about the miracles Christ performed! Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives.

The normal liturgical color of our vestments during this season is green, a color that calls us to growth in our understanding of the Gospels. It reminds us throughout the year of the hope given to us by the birth of Christ, who came as one like us to show us the path to salvation. From now until Ash Wednesday we will wear the green and Ordinary Time will continue following Pentecost until Advent.

Jesus' first miracle at the wedding in Cana underlines the resemblance between the vows spouses make to one another and the covenant that God makes with each of us. In the Old Testament, the covenant was the binding contract between God and the Chosen people, the Israelites. God pledges: "I will be your God and you will be My people." He delivered them from slavery and guided them through the desert into the Promised Land. In return, His people were to obey the Commandments, which defined the people's relationship to God and one another. In the New Testament, God extended His love and care to all. And everyone, as individuals and as a community, now has a relationship with God.

And, His Son became one of us and issued a new commandment that we love and serve one another as He did in offering His life for us. The Apostle Paul likened this new relationship to the way spouses relate to one another. He, of course used the terms of his day to explain how spouses were to love and serve each other. In the Gospel, Jesus' presence at the wedding at Cana emphasizes both the personal and communal nature of the New Covenant. And His turning water into wine so the celebration could continue demonstrates how the New Covenant of service and forgiveness is a joyful one.

Paul reminds us in the second reading from Corinthians of the many gifts each of us has been given by God and the responsibility to not only accept that gift but to live it for others. Paul provides a litany of gifts we have received: wisdom, faith, healing, mighty deeds, prophecy, discernment of spirits, varieties of tongues and their interpretation. There is a gift created in each of us that we must discern and use to build up the Body of Christ, the Church, on earth. This parish community is blessed with a myriad of gifts. Unfortunately, one of the side effects of Covid has been the withdrawal from our usual activities and ministries. It is certainly understandable with all the information that is constantly being given to us, but we can no longer continue to "hide away" if we are going to do the mission given to us by Christ. We are working hard to rebuild our community here at Saint Rose, and it is my hope that everyone will make that effort! It begins by coming back to Mass either in church or in our parking lot at 4:00 p.m. Saturday and 9:30 a.m. on Sunday. We need to take the risk to come home.....too many continue to stay away! We also need to ask ourselves what we might be able to do to help re-establish our community's ministries and programs. What gift have you been given that can help us achieve that goal? We are always in need of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Readers, Altar Servers, Ushers, Currency Engineers, and Catechists. Saint Paul tells us:

"To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit."

Let's use this new Church season to discern what we can do with the Spirit given to us.

A word of thanks to Cathy Cragin for coordinating our Christmas Sweepstakes. As usual, your response was amazing and we were able to net \$11,500. Cathy used her extraordinary organizational skills for our benefit. A great example of what Saint Paul is encouraging each of us to do.



After use, put the mask in a closed brown paper bag. The bag actually keeps the mask away from decontaminating someone else or a surface, and also keeping a dry environment in order for the virus to not spread or stay on the mask.

Experts recommend storing your mask in a paper bag for 24 to 48 hours in a dry place.

This is not recommended for health care workers, but for everyone else, it can extend the life of something we use every day.



RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.


