A Message from *Monsignor Bob*

The last days of Jesus on earth are drawing closer and closer. Soon He will return to His Father. Our Gospel this weekend demonstrates how He is trying to prepare His disciples for that Ascension Day. He speaks to them today about the commandment that He gave to us: **“My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”** That sounds so easy, and yet perhaps it is the greatest challenge anyone of us has ever been given. It does not dismiss the commandments of the Old Testament, but rather it makes it easier for us to understand and live them. Love frees us from hate and negativity. If we love as He loved, the commandments will simply become our way of life. We can release ourselves from disrespect of others, help us to walk a path of truthfulness, encourage us to be grateful for the gifts that we have been given and strengthen the bonds of love we are called to have with one another. Think about the world that this one commandment can create if only we accept the grace to live it! How is it possible to live this commandment in a world filled with so much division, confusion and outright hate? How is it possible in a world that chooses a secular way of life and disregards the teachings of Jesus? How can it happen in a world where we focus on ourselves and our needs and wants rather than the needs and wants of others? How is it possible to live a life of love when we are seeking happiness in everything the world offers rather than what Jesus chooses for us? It is not possible until that moment when every one of us commits ourselves to the teachings of Christ and open ourselves to the power of the graces He gives to us. Saint Paul tells us in the Acts of the Apostles: **“It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God.”** But is it not better that we choose that path than the one the world has set for us?

As we continue our Easter celebration, let us work to live the great commandment Christ left us and truly work to love one another without condition or hesitation. The world will be a much brighter place if we do.

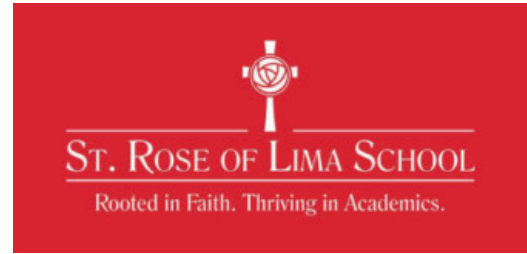
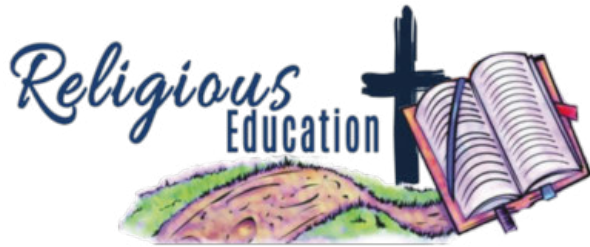

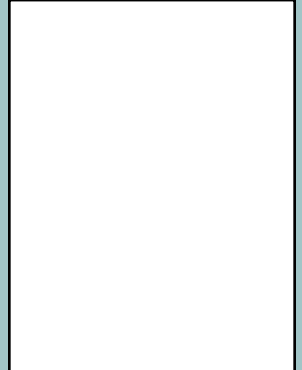
