

- A Message from Monsignor Bob-

As we approach Ascension Day this week, we listen to Jesus' farewell discourse in John's Gospel. Christ's message to us on his final days on earth is powerful and beautifully summarizes the ministry He shared with us. While He returns to the Father, He assures us that we will not be abandoned or forgotten but that the Holy Spirit will descend upon us and dwell with us forever.

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me tell you, 'I am going away and will come back to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father; for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe."

Even though Jesus offers the disciples this assurance, their fears and anxieties were heightened. They were aware how quickly people could turn against the teachings of Jesus they were asked to preach and teach and that they could experience the same suffering and humiliation Jesus did. Would this promised Advocate free them from their fears and give them the courage and faith they needed to carry on the mission Jesus gave to them? We know that when Jesus ascended into heaven, the disciples returned to that upper room, shuttering the windows and locking the doors for fear of those enemies of Christ. They prayed. They hoped. They struggled to believe they could accomplish what Christ asked of them. They were only human; how could God protect them? They began the first novena in our Church; nine days of prayer for the fulfillment of yet another promise made to them. Would their faith and trust in Jesus sustain them during this time of waiting for the Spirit? It is very easy for us to identify with the disciples during this period. It is very difficult for us not to be afraid and to trust. Are we willing to let that Spirit permeate our lives and give us the courage we need to stand against the world in the ways of truth? These are all questions to be answered as we approach Pentecost and the coming of the Spirit once again in our lives. Let us enter into our own novena of prayer and seek the strength we need to witness to Christ so that we stand unafraid in the midst of the world.



Catechists and Aides Needed


Catechists are needed to teach in grades K through 8, on Sundays, Mondays or Tuesdays.






