GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE **January 23, 2022**

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Human history reveals many periods where people lost a sense of God's transcendence. It may even be argued that human beings have been wandering and lost more than they have been at home and focused. Human nature being what it is, we struggle with who God really is — the God of our salvation history or the "gods" of human constructs. Relying on our own designs and pursuits, we forget that we really are meant to listen to One upon whom the Spirit of the Lord rests, Jesus Christ, and not to ourselves. That same history that reveals our fickleness and infidelity also reveals God's constancy and faithfulness. God always finds us.

As people wander and fumble to find their way, God is there bringing them back to holiness and giving them the assurance of His presence. We have to allow God's Word, God's life, to touch us and change us. It can make us more flexible and attentive to the sacred in all facets of life so that every day is one that is holy. Every day is a time when fulfillment is possible for one's soul. Jesus stood before those gathered in the synagogue as the fulfillment of words of promise that were echoed long ago. God doesn't forget. He always comes for us.

Now it is time to remember to go to God. Sometimes our lives are so confused and tangled that it is difficult to see the Word and hand of God. But when we realize, deep within, the depth of friendship God offers to us it really has the power to turn sadness to joy. The promise is fulfilled. Going frequently to God's Word, allowing ourselves to be enriched and rejuvenated, and pondering the certainly of God's fidelity and promise permanently transforms us. We will be more aware of the sacred and the holy and less invested in things that pull us away. ©LPi



THE JULIAN CIRCLE AT MERCY BY THE SEA

An ongoing virtual program series with Rev. Mark S. Burrows, Ph.D. Wednesdays, February 9, March 9 and April 6, 2022, 7 – 8:30 p.m. Eastern

Based on the highly popular Julian Circle that piloted in
fall 2021, Rev. Mark S. Burrows, Ph.D., will continue
to host three once-monthly Julian Circle gatherings on
Zoom beginning February, 2022. Both past participants
and newcomers are welcomed. This year's Julian Circle will take place on the second Wednesday of each
month from 7 –8:30 p.m. U.S./Eastern: February 9,
March 9 and April 6. Gatherings will focus on a different text from what Julian of Norwich simply called her
"book" (variously entitled either *Show*-

ings or Revelations of Divine Love), which will be announced in advance of each session. As a celebrated English mystic (born 1342), Julian's book is generally considered to be one of the most remarkable documents of medieval religious experience. Mark will open each month's session with a prayer and teaching to set it in context and relate it to the wider scope of Julian's thought. Then, there will be an opportunity for focused conversation, first in small break-out groups and then in a closing plenary session. The goal is to explore the wisdom of Julian's "showings," which were rooted in her courageous and imaginative vision into the depths of divine love. Participants will be invited to do what Julian herself suggested was necessary: namely, to "perform" her "showings" by appropriating the insights she recorded in her writings. In each session, participants will be encouraged to enter into the transformative power of God's love as Julian came to understand it, seeking to enter into the joy of what she called our "one-ing" with God and with one another. **Rev. Mark S. Burrows, Ph.D.** is a scholar of historical theology and a much sought-after retreat leader. He has published widely in the areas of spirituality and mysticism, theology and the arts. An oblate of Glastonbury Abbey, a Benedictine monastery in Hingham, MA, Mark is also a widely published poet and an award-winning translator of German literature. 
