DO YOU LOVE ME? - LOVE BY THE CHARCOAL FIRE

Do you love me? Fiddler on the Roof is a musical by Sheldon Harnick. It is based on the book Tevye and his Daughters by Joseph Stein, set in Tsarist Russia in 1905. There is a very tender and moving scene in the play, Fiddler on the Roof. Tevye and his wife Golda are being forced to move from their home in Russia. One day Tevye comes into the house and asks his wife, "Golda, do you love me?" "Do I what?" "Do you love me?" Golda looks at him and then responds: "Do I love you? With our daughters getting married and this trouble in the town, you're upset, you're worn out, go inside, go lie down, maybe it is indigestion." Tevye interrupts and asks the question, "Golda, do you love me?" Golda sighs as she looked at him and says, "Do I love you? For 25 years I've washed your clothes, cooked your meals, cleaned your house, given you children, milked the cows. After 25 years, why talk of love right now?" "Do you love me?" is the same question Jesus is asking Peter in the closing scene of the Gospel of John.

What a wonderful, happy meeting between Jesus and his Apostles on the lakeshore. He appears to them, so that they will have no doubt that he is risen from the dead. The meeting includes a miraculous catch of fish, followed by the human touch of Jesus preparing breakfast for the Apostles. When breakfast was over, and as they warmed themselves before the sizzling fire, Jesus asked Peter not once, but three times, "Peter, do you really love me?" Three times Peter replied, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." And then three times Jesus responded, "Feed my sheep."

John says that "Peter was hurt" by Jesus' question. That's because the triple question by Jesus evoked a painful memory of a triple denial by Peter. Who doesn't have powerful memories about standing around a fire and staring into the flames? The last time that Peter stood around a campfire was just a few days earlier, during the arrest of Jesus, when he denied three times that he even knew Jesus. In that incident, John describes how "it was cold, and the servants and officials stood around a fire they had made to keep warm. Peter was also standing with them, warming himself." (18:18). Both campfire conversations about faithfulness to Jesus were painful in the extreme. But Jesus reinstates Peter three times with the words, "Feed my sheep," and, despite his past failures, he went on to become the movement's leader.

What I find very important in this story is the way Jesus saves Peter by returning him to the source of his shame. Jesus doesn't avoid the hard conversation. He doesn't pretend that Peter's denials didn't happen and didn't wound. But neither does Jesus preach, condemn, accuse, or retaliate. He feeds. He feeds Peter's body and then he feeds Peter's soul. He surrounds the self-pitying disciple with tenderness and safety, inviting him to revisit his shame for the sake of healing, restoration, and commissioning: "Do you love me? Do you love me? Do you love me? Feed my sheep." As the shepherd appointed by the True Shepherd to do as He did, to care for the sheep, Peter also symbolizes leadership. "Feed My lambs," will continue to be the agenda of the post-Resurrection Church until the risen Lord appears in glory.

Let us pray - God our Father, may we look forward with hope to our resurrection. You made us your sons and daughters and restored the joy of our youth. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
