Background on the Gospel Reading

On the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert and temptation by the devil to the glory shown in Jesus' Transfiguration. On the first Sunday of Lent, our Gospel always tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. On the second Sunday, we always hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. The report of Jesus' Transfiguration is found in each of the Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke. The context for Luke's Transfiguration story is similar to that found in both Matthew and Mark. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' prediction about his Passion. After the prediction there is a discussion of the cost of discipleship in each of these Gospels. The placement of the Transfiguration story close to Peter's confession and Jesus' prediction encourages us to examine the Transfiguration in the larger context of the Paschal Mystery.

The Transfiguration occurs on a mountain in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples—Peter, James and John. These are among the first disciples that Jesus called in Luke's Gospel. We recently heard this Gospel at Mass, on the fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Only Luke's Gospel, which often describes Jesus at prayer, indicates that Jesus is praying as his appearance changes to bright white. Luke indicates that the three disciples were sleeping while Jesus prayed. They will be sleeping again as Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane before his Passion and death.

As they awake, Peter and the disciples see Jesus Transfigured and Elijah and Moses present with Jesus. Elijah and Moses, both significant figures in the history of Israel, represent Jesus' continuity with the Law and the Prophets. In Matthew's and Mark's Gospels, there is reference to conversation among Jesus, Elijah, and Moses, but only Luke's Gospel explains that this conversation is about Jesus' later accomplishments in Jerusalem. Luke describes this as his exodus, connecting Jesus' Passion, death, and Resurrection with the Israel's Exodus from Egypt. On witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, Peter offers to construct three tents for them. Having just awoken, perhaps Peter's offer was made in confusion. We also notice that Peter reverted from his confession that Jesus is the Messiah, calling Jesus "master" instead. As if in reply to Peter's confusion, a voice from heaven speaks, affirming Jesus as God's Son and commanding that the disciples listen to him. This voice from heaven recalls the voice that was heard at Jesus' baptism which, in Luke's Gospel, spoke directly to Jesus as God's Son. In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, the disciples keep secret what they have seen. Not until they also witness his Passion and death will the disciples understand Jesus' Transfiguration. We hear this story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection even as we prepare to remember Jesus' Passion and death.





Our Lady of the Lake Parish July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024, Fiscal Year

As I reflect on our last fiscal year with parish finances, I want to begin by thanking our faithful parishioners for their ongoing generosity in the support of our parish and all its many ministries. When we are asked to take an active role in our faith and parish, being generous stewards of our gifts to the mission of the Church, this comes in the threefold giving of time, talent, and treasure. Our main goal is to evangelize and bring Jesus, His Church, the sacraments, and His Gospel message to all peoples. We are committed to promoting the Gospel of Jesus Christ as the only way, truth, and life for ourselves and our families.

The number one source of income for our parish ministries and upkeep comes from the weekly offertory, holy days, and special parish collections such as the improvement fund, energy & utilities, and the Catholic Mirror. This past year showed a small increase of \$4,000.00.

Some of the major improvements and maintenance that we have completed for this past year included the following:

- * We are current in all our financial obligations to our vendors and to the Diocese of Springfield, MA.
- * Closed the raffle account and distributed extra funds to the soup kitchen. Switched phone systems from Comcast to Grandstream to lower monthly cost. Installed an extra phone in the kitchenette for emergencies.
- * Replaced the rusted outside door to Father Shea Hall and repaired the frame.
- Painted the stairway to the choir loft and the sacristy.
- * Transformed the St. Mark's (green) room in the Marian Hall into the Atrium for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. We have held classes there since September 2024.
- * Installed new flooring in Fr. Shea Hall due to water damage. Insurance paid all but deductible.
- * Insulation of the sacristy and Marian Hall. The total cost of \$18,892.88 was paid in full by an Eversource Energy rebate. The parish paid \$0.00.

 Installed A/C in the rectory and insulation in the attic which had very little insulation.

I would like to conclude this annual fiscal report with a list of upcoming major projects that need to be completed as we move forward into the future.

- * Repave the entire church parking lot.
- Installation of central A/C in the Marian Hall.
- * Remove pews in the main church and overlay asbestos floors which are currently underneath the pews before moving them back.
- Miscellaneous small projects for improvements and maintenance, e.g. improved signage and security system.

Please keep our parish in your daily prayers as we move forward and strive to make the best decisions possible for the good of all. As of writing this letter, we have raised nearly \$275,400.00 OR 102.53% towards our entire *Beacon of Faith* capital campaign goal which also includes pledges. Thank you so much for helping us to reach and surpass our goal! We will now receive 75% of anything raised above our original goal for the capital campaign. I look forward to all the adventures and challenges ahead of us over the next year.
