**How to Put
'The Priest Retirement Fund'
in Your Will**

After providing for your family and loved ones, you may wish to put *The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund* in your will, thus assuring the care of our 50 retired priests. Bequests are free of estate tax and can substantially reduce the amount of your assets claimed by the government. You can give needed support for *The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund* by simply including the following words in your will: "I give, devise, and bequeath to *The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund*, 49 Elm Street, Worcester, MA 01609 (insert amount being given here) to be used to support our retired diocesan priests." A bequest can be a specific dollar amount, a specific piece of property, a percentage of an estate, or all or part of the residue of an estate. You can also name *The Diocese of Worcester* as a contingency beneficiary in the event someone named in your will is no longer living. It is recommended that an attorney help in drafting or amending a will.

Monsignor Sullivan is a Notary Public

Monsignor Sullivan is a notary public. Should any parishioner need to have a document notarized you are welcome to call upon him. There is no fee. Just call the rectory should you need this service.

HOSPITAL VISITS

The in-house priest chaplains, all of whom have been vaccinated, are assuming all the pastoral needs of the hospital patients. We know that only one visitor per day is allowed for each patient and that generally eliminates the visit of a parish priest. We pray that these restrictions will soon be lifted so that we priests can resume visiting the sick in our hospitals. **However, if you would like to have a loved one visited by a priest and you let us know, Monsignor Sullivan can communicate that request to an in-house priest chaplain at all three major hospitals in the city.**

**UPCOMING ORDINATION
Next Weekend**

Worcester native, James Boulette, a diocesan seminarian at Pope Saint John XXIII National Seminary in Weston, will be ordained a transitional deacon next Saturday, May 29, at St. Paul's Cathedral. Bishop McManus will be the ordaining prelate. In one year's time James will be ordained a priest.

James is the son of two of our very proud parents, Dick and Doris Boulette. Over the years, Dick and Doris have been very active in local parishes, including St. Andrew the Apostle, Holy Name of Jesus, and for the past decade, Christ the King. Both have been Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion here and Doris assisted Sister Ellen in our Religious Education program for a number of years. You can imagine their happiness at this time!

It is the custom for a newly-ordained deacon to assist at Mass (as a deacon) the day following his ordination. James will be the deacon and homilist for our 9:00 am Mass next Sunday, May 30. Msgr. Sullivan, who has known James since birth, will celebrate that Mass. Congratulations, James. Christ the King welcomes you for this joyful occasion!

What is a Transitional Deacon?

The diaconate began in the very early Church and the deacon is ordained through the Sacrament of Holy Orders. In its earliest stages the diaconate was permanent. There are permanent deacons today as we know at Christ the King. However, this ministry evolved from a permanent state into a transitional period prior to ordination to the Priesthood, hence the distinction between a permanent deacon and a transitional deacon. The transitional diaconate is like an internship, whereby a man is ordained as a deacon and makes the promise of celibacy, and then continues final studies for the priesthood. The deacon has three essential functions: proclaim the Gospel, assist at Mass, and do charitable works. Deacons may baptize, witness and bless marriages, distribute Holy Communion, bring Viaticum to the dying, preach, and officiate at funerals and burials. Deacons cannot absolve sins in the Sacrament of Penance, offer Mass or administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

TODAY IS THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE RE-OPENING OF CHURCHES

THANKS FOR COMING TO MASS THIS PENTECOST SUNDAY!

We've had a safe re-opening Mass experience for a whole year and have celebrated 650 Masses since the re-opening of the Catholic churches last May 23.

As we write this piece and send it to the printer (last Tuesday morning) we know that the Center for Disease Control has offered more liberal guidance on mask wearing, loosening the restrictions. However, we are also told that Governor Baker will make the decisions as to the protocols observed in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. So, for the time being we must abide in Massachusetts' protocols even though we will all rejoice when the time comes that indoor mask-wearing for the fully vaccinated (second vaccination shot plus 14 days) can be observed.

There has never been a report of anyone becoming ill with the coronavirus here at Christ the King. We are regularly celebrating confessions, baptisms, funerals, weddings and other sacraments in addition to all our Masses. Persons who are ill should not come to Mass at this time. Family members generally sit together in the same pew. With the exception of your own family members you should try to sit at least six feet apart from others. Every other pew is marked off with tape. All people must wear a mask throughout the Mass with the *following exceptions*...(1) children under the age of 2 **should not wear** a mask; (2) parents will use their own discretion for those children between the age of 2 and 5 years old; (3) if a person has a medical or disabling condition they are not required to wear a mask.

Stopping the Legalization of Assisted Suicide in Massachusetts

Recently, New Mexico became the 11th jurisdiction in the United States to legalize assisted suicide. *Compassion & Choices* is celebrating and declared Massachusetts to be their next target. Happily, the initiative recently failed to pass in the legislature of our neighbor, Connecticut.

The End of Life Options Act has once again been introduced into the Massachusetts legislature. The bills have been referred to the Joint Committee on Public Health. This time around, the committee does not have any strong opponents of assisted suicide. Six members of the seventeen on the Committee are co-sponsors of the bill so far. This makes it more likely to come out of committee and be put to a vote. This means we must rely on educating people to express their opposition to their legislators and the governor.

More information about the problems with assisted suicide, this bill, and how to speak to your legislators about it will be in the bulletin in the months to come.

PENTECOST SUNDAY!

Today is Pentecost Sunday, one of the great solemnities of the Church. Only Easter ranks higher! *Pentēkostē* is the Greek name for the *Feast of Weeks*, a prominent feast in the calendar of ancient Israel celebrating the giving of the Law on Mount Sinai. This feast is still celebrated as *Shavuot* in Judaism. For Christians it became the feast commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other disciples of Jesus Christ as described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1-31). While those on whom the Spirit had descended were speaking in many languages, the Apostle Peter stood up with the Eleven and proclaimed to the crowd that this event was the fulfillment of God's word: "I will pour out my spirit." Three thousand people gladly received his word and were baptized Catholics that day. No wonder we call it the "birthday" of the Church!

And You shall renew the face of the earth.**


