The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Next Weekend!

Next weekend, August 14 and 15, Catholics celebrate the Solemnity of *The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary*. It celebrates the happy departure of Jesus' mother from this life by her natural death as well as her bodily assumption into heaven. Because so important a feast falls on a Sunday (August 15) it supplants what would normally be the 20th Sunday of the Year. The following Sunday we will jump to the 21st Sunday of the Year. The *Assumption* is the oldest continuous feast celebrating Mary. The Catholic Church has done so since at least the 500s. Over the centuries the feast has been called by different names: 'The Commemoration of Mary,' 'The Dormition of Mary,' 'The Passing of Mary,' and finally, 'The Assumption of Mary.' Pope Pius XII (1939-1958) defined Mary's 'Assumption' as a dogma after consulting with every bishop in the world who, in turn, were asked to consult the lay people of their dioceses. It was affirmed worldwide.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAMS BEGIN AGAIN IN FALL!

This fall (with the further relaxing of COVID protocols) we plan to resume our parent preparation sessions for infant baptisms in small groups. They take place in the rectory. The one-time program takes place on Sunday afternoons from 1:00 pm to 2:30 pm. The dates for the next three sessions are: **September 12; November 14; and January 16.** All parents must participate in the prep sessions, led by our prep team, if this is their first child and/or if they do not worship at Mass here on Sundays. Parents whose children are not yet born may participate in the program if they like. *Please call Monsignor Sullivan (508-754-5361) to pre-register for the program.*

We will also resume the practice of celebrating baptisms at our 11:00 am Mass on occasional Sundays (usually monthly except during Lent). We do this because, theologically, the Sacrament of Baptism is a celebration of *the community* and it is important to have a good number of the community present. Having been trained, parents choose which ceremony they would like for the baptism. The next scheduled celebrations of infant Baptism at Mass will take place on **Sundays: October 3; November 7; December 5; and January 9** ~ all at the 11:00 am Mass.

RECTORY OPEN FOR BUSINESS AS USUAL

Msgr. Sullivan has been having meetings here for over fourteen months (baptismal instructions, marriage preparation, confessions, personal conversations). Judi Brennan has been conducting Confirmation interviews here. Parishioners are coming in to see Mindy Dulude for Mass cards and other business. Please do not hesitate to come visit the rectory for your personal needs. If you have been vaccinated there is no need to wear a mask.

**Annual Mission Cooperative Appeal
Two Weeks From Now**

Every summer each local parish is asked to support a religious community that does missionary work in foreign and poor countries. This year we have been asked to support an entire diocese, the **Diocese of Long Xuyen** in southwest Vietnam. Unfortunately, a missionary will not be able to come and speak to us (distance and the pandemic being primary factors). Nevertheless, our parish will support the **Diocese of Long Xuyen** through a **special collection** here on the weekend of **August 21 and 22**. The Diocese of Long Xuyen is near the Mekong Delta and shares a border with Cambodia. About 4.2 million people live in this area. At 6,500 square miles that diocese is four times the size of the Diocese of Worcester. There are 185 parishes. They have 317 priests, 300 sisters, 97 seminarians, 184 preparatory students and nearly 1,900 catechists. Tens of thousands of North Vietnamese have migrated into this area because it is good for farming. In 1954 there were 30,000 Catholics in **Long Xuyen**. Now there are 234,000. Vietnam's population is shifting from the countryside to more industrial areas or further into isolated rural lands. This is a particular concern since many Catholics are migrating to where there are few churches or catechetical schools.

Each year **Long Xuyen** must build 5 chapels and many classrooms to accommodate so many new Catholic communities of faith. They must also train many new catechists and evangelization volunteers. This is very challenging for a poor country. They need our assistance. For the special collection in August please be generous and make your **check payable to 'Christ the King.'** In the **memo line put 'Mission Coop Appeal.'** Our parish sends one check to the Diocese for the total we collect.

**'Restore the Church, Build the Future'
Collection Next Weekend**

The countries in Central and Eastern Europe have faced a century of hardship. They have been oppressed by radical communism, horrendous crimes against humanity, and revolutionary, civil, and world wars. Under communism, religious practices were openly persecuted and atheism was actively enforced. Control of every aspect of life was taken over by totalitarian governments and the Communist Party, and civil society and the economy were deconstructed. Since the collapse of the former Soviet Union in 1991, Central and Eastern European countries have been working to rebuild their political structures, social welfare, economies and their religious life.

The annual Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe will take place next weekend. Please be generous. The collection funds projects in 28 countries to build the pastoral capacity of the Church and to rebuild and restore the faith in these countries. The funds raised in the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe are used to support the renewal of vital aspects of the Church life: seminaries, youth ministry, social service programs, pastoral centers, church construction and renovation, and Catholic communications projects. Years after the fall of communism, though some countries are now a part of the European Union and serve as examples of positive changes, a majority of the countries are lagging behind and still struggling to overcome the legacy and destruction left by the Communist system; and the Catholics of these regions continue to need our help.

HOSPITAL VISITS

The in-house priest chaplains, all of whom have been vaccinated, are assuming most of the pastoral needs of the hospital patients. Please let us know if a loved one is hospitalized, and Msgr. Sullivan will make every attempt to visit that person. Msgr. Sullivan has been visiting St. Vincent's Hospital of late.

Were You Never Confirmed?

Many of our adults, even some regularly at Mass, have never received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Please consider it! We have a process that can help you receive the Sacrament of Confirmation that completes your initiation into the Catholic Church. Msgr. Sullivan will instruct those interested. The dates of instruction are Thursday nights (7:00-8:00 pm): November 4, 11; December 2, 9, 16; and January 13). Bishop McManus will confirm these adults at St. Paul's Cathedral in early February of 2022. Candidates should be coming to Sunday Mass. Contact Msgr. Why Come to Sunday Mass?

The American Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, when conducting a retreat for teens, once gave a talk on the meaning of the Mass. He said, "If you don't get anything out of Mass, it's because you don't bring the right expectations to it." It is not entertainment. It is worship of the God who made us and saves us, an opportunity to praise and thank God for all that God has done for us. If we have a correct understanding of Mass it becomes more meaningful for us. We'll want to go to Mass. We'll understand why the Mass is God's precious gift to us, and we wouldn't think of refusing that gift. Here are some reasons to go to Mass:

The third of the Ten Commandments given to Moses by God is, "**Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day.**"

The Mass was instituted at the Last Supper by Jesus. **He said, "Do this in memory of me."** When we participate in the Mass we remember his great act of love for us on the Cross so that we can live with him forever in heaven.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that Mass attendance on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is the first of the six *Commandments of the Church*. These **commandments** also require receiving Communion at least once a year during the Easter season, confessing any mortal sin as a preparation for Communion, and observing the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence.

The **Mass is the perfect sacrifice** created by Jesus. Through the priest we offer Jesus, *Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity*, to the Father, just as Jesus offered Himself to the Father on the Cross.

Jesus said, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." **Receiving Holy Communion strengthens our union with Jesus.** He lives within us in a special way. The Mass increases our love of God and neighbor.

God wants us to **come together in community** to worship Him. Jesus said, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in your midst."

God will help us experience the tremendous benefits of the Mass. Bring an **attitude of prayer and thanksgiving** to Mass, and you will reap great spiritual riches: consolation, confidence, happiness, and spiritual strength for the challenges of life.


