

By and large, people knew planning was necessary, but, for a variety of reasons, most of which were rooted in fear and misinformation, the actual creation of the documents was difficult and therefore, postponed or altogether avoided. Common excuses Liz heard: Too expensive. Too intimidating. Too overwhelming. Too distasteful to think about. Too much legal mumbo jumbo. Common misconceptions people told Liz: I am too young to plan. Why estate plan when I don't have an estate? My family knows what I want-why write it down? In the end, the state will get everythingwhy bother? I distrust lawyers; I will do it myself. Liz devised WILL PARTY in response to the foregoing comments. Liz wanted to use her education, her experience and her expertise to debunk the myths and to empower people to help themselves.

IS WILL PARTY JUST FOR FIRST TIMERS? For those of you who have already planned, congratulations! You are also invited to the informational session. WILL PARTY is not just for those who haven't taken the plunge. For those who have previously planned, ask yourself: How many years has it been since the documents were prepared for you? Did a lawyer prepare the documents for you? Were the documents explained to you before you signed them and did you understand the contents of the documents? OUR LADY OF THE VALLEY SCHOOL, UXBRIDGE ANNOUNCES THE FR. DENNIS J. O'BRIEN ACADEMIC WING AT THE G.R.A.C.E. CENTER



Since the passing of Fr. Dennis O'Brien this past July, friends, stu-

dents and former parishioners have sought to memorialize him in a very special way. An effort is now underway to raise funds to name the academic wing of The Grace Rett Athletic Complex and Education Center at Our Lady of the Valley School in Uxbridge in honor of Fr. Dennis J. O'Brien. The G.R.A.C.E. Center includes a gymnasium, two classrooms that will house a middle school academy, a concessions area, lobby and restrooms. Grace Rett tragically died in January 2020 one day after her twentieth birthday in a motor vehicle accident in Florida while training with the members of her rowing team from the College of the Holy Cross. Fr. O'Brien was greatly affected by Grace's passing and the depth of her faith. He would often visit her grave site to pray for strength and intercession whenever faced with a difficult challenge. Like so many, he found courage and conviction through the story of Grace.

Fr. Dennis was a "witness and a messenger, a prophet and evangelizer, proclaiming the word of God everywhere he went – yes, with words, but even more so with loving actions. Fr. Dennis has truly revealed the face of Christ to us as he embodied the true joy of the Gospel". Parishioners from Sacred Heart in Hopedale, St. Leo and Our Lady of the Lake in Leominster, St. Mary in Shrewsbury, St. Joseph in Fitchburg, Holy Trinity in Harvard/Bolton, and parishes throughout the Blackstone Valley have all been touched and impacted by Fr. Dennis' commitment not only to preach the Gospel but also to live out the Gospel. In gratitude for the gift of his life and priestly ministry, you are invited to participate in this effort to honor Fr. Dennis O'Brien.

My dear brothers and sisters in the Lord,

January 22, 2022 marks the 49th anniversary of the tragic *Roe v. Wade* Supreme Court decision which, with its companion case *Doe v. Bolton*, legalized abortion throughout all nine months of pregnancy in every state in the nation. The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (n. 373)*, designates Saturday, January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children". All the faithful in dioceses throughout the United States of America are called to observe this day in a spirit of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

Forty-nine years of legalized abortion in this country has left an incomprehensible aftermath. With over 63 million lives lost, and countless women and men, mothers and fathers, grandparents, siblings, and friends who have been deeply wounded physically, emotionally, and spiritually by this tragedy, we need now more than ever to re-commit ourselves to defending life. I encourage our diocesan parishes and institutions, and all the faithful, to observe reverently the Day of **Prayer and Penance on January 22**nd both personally and within your communities. Fervent prayer is especially needed in light of the possible overturning of *Roe v. Wade* in the *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health* case currently before the U.S. Supreme Court. At stake is a Mississippi law banning abortions after 15 weeks. The Supreme Court is expected to issue its ruling in June. (More information about this landmark case can be found at <u>prayfordobbs.com.</u>) Let us unite our hearts and minds through special acts of prayer, fasting, and sacrifice on this day and in the months to come, to uphold the inherent dignity of all human life from conception to natural death.

As we reflect on this unspeakable tragedy, we also recall how the Church for many years has continued to reach out to those who have been so sadly affected by the culture of death, particularly through ministries providing aid to women and families in crisis pregnancies, offering the healing love and mercy of Christ to those wounded by abortion through the ministry of Project Rachel, and by continuing to teach and preach the truth and beauty about love and life that bring authentic freedom and happiness. It is through our prayers, charitable works, and loving sacrifices that the culture can be transformed.

Let us take this opportunity of the January 22nd Day of Prayer and Penance to renew our resolve to live and proclaim the Gospel of Life. May we respond generously to the challenge Saint Pope John Paul II put forth in *Evangelium vitae*: "A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. May an impassioned plea rise to God, the Creator and Lover of life, from the heart of every believer." Our active participation in the shared commitment to the sacredness of human life and the dignity of the human person will, with God's grace, truly work toward the building up of a Culture of Life and a Civilization of Love.
