The Catholic Stance on Life - No Gray Areas

As Catholics, we are called to be unwavering in our defense of life from conception to natural death. The Church's teaching on the sanctity of life is clear and absolute, leaving no room for ambiguity. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person – among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life" (CCC 2270).

Pope St. John Paul II reaffirmed this in his encyclical Evangelium Vitae (The Gospel of Life), emphasizing that abortion is a grave moral disorder because it is the deliberate killing of an innocent human being. He urged all Catholics to be advocates for the voiceless and vulnerable, highlighting that "we need to bring the Gospel of life to the heart of every man and woman and to make it penetrate every part of society" (Evangelium Vitae, 80).

In a world where the sanctity of life is often challenged, it is our duty to stand firm. By supporting pro-life initiatives, providing compassionate care for those in crisis, and advocating for just laws, we live out our faith in action.

Let us be bold in our defense of life, knowing that we are upholding the dignity of every human being as created in the image and likeness of God.

The Grave Situation in Maryland

Currently, in Maryland, there is a grave situation with the proposed abortion amendment that seeks to enshrine the right to late-term abortion in the state constitution. This amendment would allow abortions up to the moment of birth, threatening the lives of countless unborn children. As Catholics, we must oppose this amendment and protect the sanctity of life.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha and Our Lady of Mount Carmel

On July 14, we celebrate the feast of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Native American saint, who is known for her deep faith, humility, and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Kateri's life was marked by hardship and suffering, yet she remained steadfast in her love for Christ and her commitment to living a life of holiness. Born in 1656 in what is now New York State, Kateri was orphaned at a young age and later baptized.

In the same week, we also honor Our Lady of Mount Carmel and the Brown Scapular on July 16. The Brown Scapular is a sacramental associated with the Carmelite Order, and it signifies a special devotion to Mary and a commitment to living a life of prayer and service. According to tradition, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a Carmelite friar, in 1251 and gave him the scapular as a sign of her protection. The scapular is a symbol of Mary's maternal care and a reminder of our call to follow her Son.

These two celebrations highlight the importance of devotion to Mary in the life of the Church. Through her intercession, we can grow in our relationship with Jesus and deepen our commitment to living as His disciples. The Brown Scapular is a tangible sign of this devotion, encouraging us to live lives of holiness and service.

As we honor Saint Kateri Tekakwitha and Our Lady of Mount Carmel, let us ask for their intercession and strive to imitate their virtues. May we grow in our love for Christ and His Mother, and may we be inspired to live lives of faith, hope, and charity.






