

Weekly Reflection

Every parent can relate to this Gospel. The thought of a child getting lost, no matter their age brings anxiety and stress! The relief of Mary and Joseph is palpable in this passage even though the 12-year-old Jesus acts surprised about his parents' concern. However, what is most important to glean from this gospel is the fact that upon returning to Nazareth, Jesus "was obedient to them; and. . . Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor." Their years together provided important time for growth for the Holy Family. The vocation of parents, grandparents and guardians is both rewarding and challenging. Take time to think about the example of the Holy Family and let them be a source of strength for you and for all families.

From the Pandemic Response Team:

In the light of spiking numbers of new COVID cases and the likely increase in those numbers in the upcoming holiday season, Cardinal Seán is mandating that throughout the archdiocese all people attending public Masses, including weddings and funerals, wear masks. This mandate takes effect the weekend of December 18/19, 2021, and expires on January 17, 2022. Mass celebrants, deacons, readers, servers, choir members, and instrumentalists, should all wear masks except when they are speaking.

Children under the age of five are not required to wear masks. Children under the age of two should not wear masks.

Pastor's Corner

On behalf of the Fr. Leclerc, the staff of Saint John's and all of our wonderful volunteers, I want to wish everyone a very merry and holy Christmas celebration and Season as we are drawn to the manger with shepherds and kings and everyone in between to greet the newborn Savior, our Lord Jesus Christ. It is our hope that the Advent Season has encouraged hope and joy and that those gifts are realized in the celebration of Christmas. Matthew tells us that the birth of Jesus Christ came about through the power of the Holy Spirit and the humble willingness of Mary to acquiesce to the will of God in her life. We follow her example in this Season of Christmas by accepting those gifts from God which can increase our holiness and make us more willing to accept the blessings from God which are available to us every day in Jesus. May the spirit of Christmas and a sense of grateful generosity be alive in us each day of the year and may our practice of the presence of God available to us in the Holy Eucharist bring us closer to Christ.

Because our celebration of Christmas falls on a Saturday this year, we accept the happy coincidence of celebrating with the whole Church the Blessed and Holy Family of Jesus and Mary and Joseph on this same weekend. While we will not celebrate the Saturday vigil Mass, ordinarily prayed at 4:00p.m., we will celebrate Mass for the Holy Family on Sunday, December 26th at 9:00a.m. and 11:00a.m. The celebration of the Holy Family is appropriately offered as juxtaposed with Christmas because it was the struggle, sacrifice and love of family that moved Mary and Joseph to accept the blessing of the Infant Jesus and to offer Him to the world. These three are a model for families of every shape and color all over the world as we try to negotiate what is at times a very difficult path toward God and love of one another.

We remember in a special way those families, and there are many of us, who have endured

hardship and even the death too soon of our loved ones. We pray for those families who long to have their sons and daughters returned to them safely from military service or other sacrificial work. We pray in a special way for those families who struggle with addiction and the deleterious outcomes of such and for those mothers and fathers whose children are alienated from them in any way. We ask for the grace and blessing of gratitude for those gifts from God which brings families closer together in recognition of the goodness of the practice of the faith and that the lessons gently taught by good and sacrificial parents will be carried on by grateful children. Jesus and Mary and Joseph give good example and hope to all families who live and love in the shadow of our Christmas celebration and we are thankful. Thanks and have a great week. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.
