



From the Pandemic Response Team:



In the light of spiking numbers of new COVID cases and the likely increase in those numbers in the upcoming holiday season, Cardinal Seán is mandating that throughout the archdiocese all people attending public Masses, including weddings and funerals, wear masks. This mandate takes effect the weekend of December 18/19, 2021, and expires on January 17, 2022. Mass celebrants, deacons, readers, servers, choir members, and instrumentalists, should all wear masks except when they are speaking.

Children under the age of five are not required to wear masks. Children under the age of two should not wear masks.

Pastor's Corner

The 9th of January brings with it the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord and the Gospel is taken from the writing of Luke. Baptism is perhaps the most familiar of the sacraments beside the Eucharist as most of us who believe in Christ have been dipped into the waters of His Life, Death and Resurrection and await union with Him in the next life. Before Jesus was baptized by John in the waters of the Jordan River, baptism was a ritual performed by the prophets as a sign of new purity and a washing away of sin in the Name of God. Jesus is baptized by John and, given His nature as the sinless presence of God, He purifies the water of all baptism and so encourages the baptized after Him to be dipped into the good example of His life, unity with His suffering, and with the blessings that He provides in hope of our resurrection after Him.

Each time that anyone, tiny or not, is baptized in the Name of the Father and Son and Holy Spirit with water and in faith he or she is united to and sealed with the character of Christ. This seal and character remains with the baptized until death no matter where that person would wander. It is a sign which encourages faith, hope, and love of God and neighbor and is indelible. It is our baptism which urges us to move forward to receive Christ in the Eucharist and which encourages the possibility of growth in faith throughout our lives. It is our baptism which draws us together with all believers and urges our participation with them in the common priesthood which begs our unity with Christ in the sacrifice of the Mass.

It is our baptism which calls each one of us to a sacrificial love of neighbor which includes many of the ways of generosity in which we participate at our spiritual home which is Saint John's. We give generously for the life and sustenance of the parish and we commit to service in the name of Christ so that others might be satisfied. We give food and other goods so those who have less will grow and be sustained and we give gifts of time, talent and treasure, all in the name of God. We ask you to continue to pray for the people of St. Peter's parish with whom we will collaborate very soon as we look to be a community united in the faith of our baptism and in love. We invite all of you to come and enjoy Lessons and Carols under the direction of our choir on this Sunday at 3:00p.m. Thanks and have a great week. God Bless, Fr. Joe.
