



In the light of spiking numbers of new COVID cases and the likely increase in those numbers in the upcoming holiday season, Cardinal Seán is mandating that throughout the archdiocese all people attending public Masses, including weddings and funerals, wear masks. This mandate takes effect the weekend of December 18/19, 2021, and expires on January 17, 2022. Mass celebrants, deacons, readers, servers, choir members, and instrumentalists, should all wear masks except when they are speaking.

Weekly Reflection

"Do whatever he tells you." These are the words of Mary at the end of today's gospel! Mary is saying these words to us — to each and every one. What is Jesus telling you to do? The psalm gives us one way — 'proclaim God's marvelous deeds." St. Paul also reminds us that each one of us has special gifts, gifts that are different in each person. As you take time this week in prayer, humbly acknowledge the gifts that are uniquely yours from God. Then, like Mary, do whatever Jesus tells you, putting your gifts at the service of others.

Pastor's Corner

The first of the movements of Jesus' public ministry described in the Gospel of John occurs at a wedding feast at Cana at which Jesus, at the request of His mother, turns many gallons of water into wine to help the hosts save face subsequent to them running out of wine. It is a story familiar to even children in Religious Education programs and it should be familiar to all of us. But perhaps not regarding its spiritual and eschatological meaning. There is great significance to the inclusion of the mother of Jesus in the episode and it is important that John mentions her only here and at the foot of the Cross. The mother of Jesus, a name used instead of the personal name of Mary in order for her to stretch what she represents from merely a close family member to a standard for discipleship. Her utterance here of "do whatever He tells you" gives her a humble stance which acknowledges that Jesus is to be followed as the offer of salvation. The mother of Jesus frames the entire structure and journey of His message and ministry as she only appears again when He is offered on the Cross. She is the true and leading disciple whose humble acceptance of His place as primary is a lesson to all those who will accept discipleship and follow Him.

The water is important to the story's spiritual message as well. It is a well-known sign of the call to ritual purity in the history of Israel and to have it turned into the richness of wine is to recall God's offer of favor to the Israelites in the pages of the Prophets. Jesus is the action of God's grace which and is His offer of salvation. The prophet Amos says, "the mountains shall drip with the juice of grapes, and all the hills shall run with it". It is this rich symbol, plentiful in the history of the Old Testament, which is at the center of the celebratory beginning of the public ministry of Jesus and which kicks off as it were, all of the other keys moments of the revelation of Jesus as Savior over His three year walk to the Cross.

The revelation of Jesus as Savior happens each time the Mass is celebrated and so we hope that, given our strict precautions and close attendance to healthy protocols, that we will see many more of you coming to the Sunday celebration of the Mass as we proceed with the New Year and with the Season of Ordinary Time. We realize that there are some who have been or are compromised and so the Sunday 11:00a.m. is also streamed on our Saint John the Evangelist Music Facebook page. Please consider looking in and praying the Mass as one community going forward. We thank you for your continued generosity which is applied to the needs of our parish.
