

### From the Pandemic Response Team:







In the light of spiking numbers of new COVID cases and the likely increase in those numbers in the upcoming holiday season, Cardinal Seán is mandating that throughout the archdiocese all people attending public Masses, including weddings and funerals, wear masks. This mandate takes effect the weekend of December 18/19, 2021, and expires on January 17, 2022. Mass celebrants, deacons, readers, servers, choir members, and instrumentalists, should all wear masks except when they are speaking.

Children under the age of five are not required to wear masks. Children under the age of two should not wear masks.

### Weekly Reflection

Re-read today's Gospel. Put yourself in the scene: you are in the synagogue, perhaps your family is beside you. Jesus, the carpenter's son, gets up to read - He is serving as "the lector." The carpenter's son reads a passage from the prophet Isaiah about the promise of the Messiah. Upon finishing, he looks at the people gathered and says: "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Who are the blind, or the oppressed or the poor in your life that need to hear the "Good News" of Jesus Christ? Today, you are that lector!

# Pastor's Corner

The Gospel passage chosen for proclamation on this third Sunday in Ordinary Time is taken from Luke and describes a dramatic scene in which Jesus, undertaking His public ministry in its early stage, returns to Nazareth where He grew up and with confidence begins to teach in the synagogue of the people there. It is with temerity and in the power of the Spirit says Luke that Jesus entered the synagogue and stands to unroll the scroll of Isaiah. There He finds the passage familiar to most of the faithful. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let oppressors go free and proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." Imagine the reaction of shock on the part of the faithful and practicing listeners! Who is this, who is Jesus who we know and have seen as a neighbor growing up? Why is He standing in the synagogue teaching? But this is the way Luke starts His ministry. The Isaiah scroll and its proclamation by Jesus describes as primary, Jesus' mission to the poor that they might be the first to be offered salvation. (Remember, Luke gives a hint of such in his Infancy narrative, depicting shepherds from the fields as those who first gather around the child, not Kings as in Matthew.)

What is truly revealing and amazing is that after finishing with the teaching and sitting down, He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing", which basically amounts to announcement that He is the awaited savior. Beyond what is included in this section of the passage there is clarity offered regarding Jesus' mission. Isaiah describes good news as being brought to the poor and liberty to all of the inhabitants of Israel. He uses the word which translated jubilee to describe this freedom from burden. One may be familiar with the proclamation of Jubilee Years in the history of

the Church. What comes with these celebrations is freedom from debt and other obligations and the announcement have their root in the Isaiah scroll proclaimed by Jesus and in the truth of His being its fulfillment. While the poor will be those to first receive the good news of Jesus' message, Jesus, as we know will also reach out to those across whose paths He comes as He walks to Jerusalem who have a spiritual poverty because of the burden of selfishness or sin.

Luke's message of a preferential option for the poor in relation to the offer of salvation given in Jesus is alive and well in all communities of faith which work so that the poor might be comforted. We work for affordable housing and healthcare and so that an abundance of food might be available to those who have less or even none. Please respond to those opportunities in our own parish and others in our neighboring surroundings to provide assistance to such organizations as Saint Vincent DePaul and others and do so as a response to the message of Jesus offered in this weeks' gospel of Luke.
