

A GOSPEL REFLECTION . . . Even Thomas struggles to remove his boulder! Thomas's boulder is heavy with mistrust. Many of ours are too. A certain amount of skepticism is good, as it can save us from being duped or misled. But we can become so skeptical that it erodes our ability to trust anything. Skepticism can actually be a well-disguised defense mechanism to prevent us from being hurt or perceived as a fool. Thomas could not even trust the word of his friends.

We have to believe that what the witnesses say is true, especially when they are credible. We have to trust that the risen Christ is alive in us, too!

While the first witnesses to the resurrection have faded into history, there are many others. They are the martyrs, the people in our communities who cling to their faith, those who have touched despair and found new hope and the ones who, in spite of ridicule, pursue their thirst for God. They are our friends, acquaint-ances, biblical heroes, and saints, convinced that they have seen the Lord! The risen Christ may not surprise us with the same kind of visit as he did the first disciples, but God finds other ways. All we have to do is open our eyes and exclaim: "My Lord and my God!"
