
A GOSPEL REFLECTION . . . Jesus tells his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of conflict or affliction.

The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering, not necessarily in its absence. The world and our lives are so unpredictable. If we look for a source of lasting peace only there, something will always unsettle us. The Jewish disciples could relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They knew that it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing.

Wholeness and wellbeing are what is uncovered when we see the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise. God's Divine life flows through our bones. It is that close and deep. As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in suffering, rejection, even death. ©LPi
