

From the Pastor's Desk...

It is with a heavy heart that I announce that I will be leaving St. George as Pastor at the end of June. As you know I was appointed here in 2015 and given a six-year term which ends June 30. Archbishop Blair, in consultation with his advisors has ask me to accept a new pastoral appointment to the Church of St. Mary in Simsbury to succeed Msgr. Frank Matera who is retiring. While it is a compliment to have the Archbishop recognize that my talents as a pastor are what are needed at this time at St. Mary parish, it is still very hard to leave behind this beautiful community of St. George. You are a wonderful parish community; warm, welcoming and supportive! From the moment I stepped into this parish I could tell what a special community this is. I have been blessed also to work with a dedicated staff of very talented people, without whom the operation of this parish would come to a grinding halt.

I know this brings sadness to you as parishioners here. It is difficult to build a relationship with a pastor, whom you come to trust with the most poignant moments of your lives. I so appreciate the trust you have placed in me – it is humbling, and I acknowledge what a privilege it is. To serve any parish well, a priest must open his heart to that parish community, which means these leave-takings will always be painful. I accept that as part of my responsibility as a good shepherd, even though I know its consequences. For I know it would be impossible to serve you well unless I did so. Still, I also know that I was ordained to serve not just one parish, but the wider Archdiocesan Church. Over the nearly 30 years of my priesthood, I have learned that God always has a part in these transitions. I may not see or understand why now and why Simsbury, but I trust I will come to know that as time passes.

Some have asked about Fr. Dennis' status, and I'm sorry to say he too will be leaving at the same time. Due to his health conditions and mobility challenges, he is unable at present to give 100% to his responsibilities as a parochial vicar. For this and other reasons it would be an unfair responsibility to place on you and your next pastor if he were to stay.

Speaking of your next pastor, I am pleased to announce that he is Fr. Kevin Dillon, currently serving as pastor of Our Lady of Victory Parish in West Haven. Fr. Dillon was ordained in 2000 and served as pastor of St. Aloysius in Plantsville prior to coming to West Haven. I am sure you will give him the same warm welcome you have given to me and work together with him to continue to grow and thrive as the St. George Parish family.

I thank you all from the bottom of my heart, for all the love and support you have given me, and I am grateful for these six years we have been together. You will forever be in my heart and in my prayers. I love you and will miss you all!

Saint of the Week – St. Bede the Venerable



St. Bede never ventured more than a few miles from his home in Jarrow in the United Kingdom. Born around the year 672, he began studies in the school of the local English Benedictine monastery of SS. Peter and Paul at an early age. Always eager to learn he became an extraordinary scholar mastering the disciplines of philosophy, astronomy, arithmetic, grammar, church history, the lives of Saints, and Sacred Scripture. He eventually entered the monastery becoming a monk in his teens. At the age of 30 he was ordained a priest and, in addition to his regular monastery duties on the farm and in the monastery kitchen, he celebrated Mass daily for the other monks. He pursued further education and learning, as well as teaching in the monastery school, turning down the request to become abbot so that he could concentrate on his studies. He wrote over 45 books, including 30 Scripture commentaries, and translated and copied hundreds of other books in the monastery scriptorium. His most well-known work was the *Ecclesiastical History of the English People*. Bede devoted his life to prayer, fasting and works of charity and hospitality. His writings on Scripture were so well received that even during his lifetime, a Council of the Church ordered that they be ready publicly in churches throughout the region. Having left the monastery only once in his lifetime, he died there on the vigil of the Ascension – May 26, 735. Pope Leo XIII canonized him and declared him a Doctor of the Church in 1899. His feast day is shared with Pope St. Gregory VII and St. Mary Magdalene de Pazzi on May 25th.






