

From the Pastor's Desk...

The Body & Blood of Christ

Next weekend we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (formerly known as Corpus Christi) giving us an opportunity to delve more deeply in the mystery of Christ's true presence in Holy Communion. In the consecration at Mass, when the priest says the words, "Take this all of you and eat of it. THIS IS MY BODY which will be given up for you," the bread ceases to be bread in its substance and is transformed into the Body of Christ. The same is true of the wine, being transformed into the Blood of Christ at the words, THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD..." In Catholic theology this is known as "transubstantiation." Although still having the appearance of bread and wine, these elements have been substantially changed into Christ's Body and Blood. How? We can't explain. That they truly become Christ's Body and Blood is a matter of faith. In John's Gospel Jesus addresses the question of the Jewish leaders, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus replies emphatically, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you.... For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink," (Jn. 6:52-55). We are called to believe. St. Thomas Aquinas in his great Eucharistic Hymn the *Tantum Ergo*, which we sing at Benediction, says it well: "What the senses fail to fathom, let us grasp with faith's consent." Once we begin to grasp in faith that this is no ordinary piece of bread we receive, nor simply a "symbol" of Christ's presence, we may feel incredibly unworthy to receive Christ in the Eucharist. And while it is important that we prepare ourselves to receive by examining our consciences and striving to be free of sin by seeking the sacramental grace of reconciliation as needed, the reality is that none of us will ever be truly "worthy." Yet that is what is so amazing! Jesus gives us his Body and Blood as pure gift! We don't deserve it. We can't earn it. It is simply gift. Pope Francis tells us that the Eucharist is "not a prize for the perfect, but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak," (Joy of the Gospel, 47).

If there is anything which causes you to question whether you should be receiving the Eucharist or not, please speak to me about it. I have found over the years that many people have misunderstandings of church teaching around this question. None of us may be worthy, but Christ makes us worthy and wants us to receive this life-giving nourishment. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day!" (Jn. 6:54). Perhaps this week as we ready ourselves for this great celebration of Christ's life-giving Body and Blood, we may take some time in prayer and meditation to reflect on what we believe about the Eucharist, maybe even attend Eucharistic Adoration on Monday evening, prepare our souls through a good confession if we haven't been in a while, and receive the Lord's true presence with open hearts next weekend!




Saint of the Week – St. Boniface

Born "Winifred" in 675 of a respected and prosperous family in the Anglo-Saxon town of Crediton, Boniface became a Benedictine monk at an early age against the wishes of his father. He taught in the abbey school and was ordained a priest when he was 30. At the request of Pope Gregory II, Boniface was sent on a missionary journey in 719 to Germanic areas of the Frankish Empire, what would later become Germany. Finding many theological errors among the Christians there as well as many who had lapsed back into paganism, he dedicated his life to reforming the German Church. Bearing a letter of recommendation from Charles Martel, the powerful Frankish ruler and grandfather of Charlemagne, and with the authority of Pope Gregory, Boniface returned to Germany in 722, was made Archbishop of Mainz and successfully reorganized the whole German Church. He restored the faith of German clergy in their bishops and the pope and established numerous houses of prayer following the model of Benedictine monasteries. Boniface also persuaded monks and nuns from England to come to Germany to establish schools and provide education to the young. During a later visit to Germany, Boniface and 52 of his companions were ambushed on June 5, 754 in Frisia and put to death while preparing converts for Confirmation. He is known as the "Apostle to the Germans," and honored as a martyr of the Church on June 5th, his feast day.

Update from the Archdiocese Regarding Dispensation & COVID Restrictions

As a reminder, in light of recent developments from the civil authorities regarding COVID19 measures, Archbishop Blair has announced two items of particular importance to our Parish Community:

- **As of May 19, 2021**, the COVID-19 restrictions and procedures first implemented on May 27, 2020, in the document Opening Churches for Public Worship In The Archdiocese of Hartford has been revoked.
- **As of this past Saturday, May 22, 2021**, the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation will no longer be in force.

However, since the risk of infection, though diminished, still remains, the following individuals may very legitimately decide not yet to attend church:

- Those suffering from serious pre-existing conditions making them more susceptible to COVID-19
- Those who are ill, homebound or who are caregivers in close contact with someone who is
- Those who have tested positive for any contagious disease, including COVID-19
- Those who are in quarantine due to exposure to any contagion, or who reside with someone who is quarantined.

These individuals are encouraged to continue viewing televised and live streamed Masses.

The following indoor guidelines have been changed as of May 22nd:

- 100% capacity with no pew tape/ropes or specific social distancing
- Congregational singing is permitted once again with masks
- Holy water fonts will remain empty and there will still be no Offertory procession
- We will continue to use the offertory boxes in lieu of passing the basket. The boxes can be found in each section of the Church

Ministry meetings:

- 100% capacity in the Hall with use of tables and no specific social distancing
- Masks still required during meetings
- Coffee and.. and any other food gathering is still suspended, until the mask requirement is gone.



Saint George Raised Bed Garden

The St. George Raised Bed Garden has been constructed and fenced! We are offering parishioners the opportunity to use a 4' x 5' section of the garden. The beds will be 13" high with wood chip covered paths between. The beds will be filled with a soil compost blend and will not need lime or fertilizer. Some seed and plants will be available. We hope this will give you an opportunity to raise fresh vegetables for your use and/or to contribute to the food bank.

Some garden rules will be:

1. No pets.
2. Any children must be supervised.
3. Garden gate must be closed when leaving.
4. Garden during the day – no access at night.


