

From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Parishioners,

When I was ordained a priest 21 years ago, celebrating a funeral with cremated remains present was something that rarely happened. Now, it is quite common. I would guess that about 40% of funerals are celebrated with the cremated remains present. As we all know, the church no longer opposes cremation. The concern that I have is with the frequency of the cremated remains not being buried or entombed is on the increase. I gather this might be in part attributed to people not being aware of what the church teaching regarding cremated remains is. For those who are unaware, the church teaches that just as with the physical body of a person being recognized as having been a temple of the Holy Spirit and is accorded the reverence and dignity that comes from having been a temple of God's Holy Spirit, cremated remains are to be afforded that same reverence and dignity as well because they are from a person who was a temple of the God's Holy Spirit. Having been a temple of God's Holy Spirit means that our mortal remains are to be given a permanent, dignified resting place either in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium. In conjunction with this, as a sign of reverence for the deceased, cremated remains are not to be scattered on the land or sea or divided up among family members. I hope this is helpful to those families who have chosen cremation.

I'm so glad, as I imagine all of you are, that Hurricane Henri turned out to be a rather mild rain event for us. I know that so many of us were worried about the potential damage, and loss of power, that the storm could have caused if it held to its projected course of making landfall somewhere in the New Haven area. I'm grateful to those who livestreamed both the Vigil Mass and the 10am Mass on Sunday. Livestreaming is a wonderful way for us to be able to worship with our parishioners who are unable to make it to the weekend masses. As I expected, every mass did have parishioners at it. I had mentioned to a few people prior to the masses that I've never had an occasion where at least one person didn't show up; no matter how severe the weather was. As in any severe weather event, one's safety always comes first and one's decision to remain home out of concern for one's safety is always respected as the right decision to make.

Over sixty people actively participated in last year's program and we are hoping others will join us in these courses as we come together to know God better for ourselves and to serve Him and others. Participants will meet every week to view an engaging video presentation followed by a time of lively group discussion and fellowship. PROPHETS: *Messengers of God's Mercy* **Monday Mornings at 9:30 at St. George's Hall**

If we consider that God is the Divine Bridegroom and the Church is his Bride, then the prophets can be seen as "spiritual marriage counselors." They afflict the comfortable and comfort the afflicted, calling us to return to our covenant relationship with God. They urge us to repentance, warn us of the dangers of sin, and announce the blessings of faithfulness. Their prophetic words speak to us even today, as they draw us closer to our heavenly Bridegroom.

Participants will begin a ten-weeks Bible study Prophets: Messengers of God's Mercy on **September 13, Monday at 9:30 AM at St. George Hall.**

HEBREWS: *The New and Eternal Covenant*

Tuesdays Mornings at 9:30 at St. George's Hall or Tuesdays Evenings at 6:30 at St. Margaret's Parish Center

In this study, Catholics will be able to see, appreciate, and take hold of the riches God has given them in the New Covenant. Highlighting the critical distinctions between the Old and New Covenants, Hebrews will help Catholics get to know the generosity of the Father's heart in a deeper way than ever before. Sts. George and Margaret's will begin two separate classes on Hebrews on **September 14 at 9:30 AM and 6:30 PM.**

Participants will meet every week to view an engaging video presentation by Dr. Andrew Swafford and Jeff Cavins, followed by a time of lively group discussion and fellowship.

The Gospel of Matthew: *The King and His Kingdom* **Wednesday Mornings at 9:30 AM at St. George's Hall**

The book of Matthew brings the history of Christ to life. We see Jesus as the awaited Messiah who fulfills the promises and prophecies of the Old Testament, establishes the New Law, and inaugurates the kingdom of heaven. Matthew: The King and His Kingdom, a twenty-four-part Bible study, explores how Jesus is challenging and empowering us to a new level of holiness and shows how we must be thoroughly immersed in the kingdom of heaven on earth, the Church, to live it.

Participants will begin on **September 15** and meet every week to view an engaging video presentation followed by a time of lively group discussion and fellowship.

The BIBLE Timeline: *The Story of Salvation* **Wednesday Evenings at 6:30 at St. George's Hall**

Reading the Bible should bring us closer to Christ, but understanding it is often difficult. The good news is that you can understand the Bible, and *The Bible Timeline*, a twenty-four-part Bible study, makes it easy. The Bible Timeline should be considered as your first course in this Great Adventure of Bible Study.



These sacred hymns become our heartfelt response to God's loving and wondrous deeds for us. Their words captivate the imagination and draw us into a deeply personal encounter with God.

Participants will begin the eleven-week Bible study on *Psalms: The School of Prayer* on **Thursday, September, 16, from 6:30-8:30 PM.**



33 Day Consecration to Jesus through Mary

For many years, St. George parishioners have participated in the Annual HomeFront Project, helping to spruce up the homes of local residents who have been unable to complete projects due to financial, physical, or other challenging circumstances. HomeFront, along with local volunteers, provides services that enable homeowners to both maintain and stay living in the homes they love.

This year HomeFront has selected a Guilford residence. The home is a single-family, two-story home that is in need of exterior painting. Our young adult group, which would normally be going to Appalachia, has stepped up to paint the interior of the home. However, there is significant additional prep work to be done before the exterior painting can be applied. We will need a large group of volunteers to tackle this project. St. George parishioners have always stepped up, and so we are asking again for volunteers to help with this project. The planned date for this project would be Saturday, Sept. 11 with a rain date of Sept. 25.

Additionally, HomeFront limits the height to which a volunteer may climb. Due to the height of this home, all volunteers will be working on the first level of the home. We are looking for a professional painting company that would be willing to tackle the second floor and above. All paint and painting supplies will be provided. The second floor of the home is shingled and in very good condition. If you are a professional painter and would be willing to give of your time and talents for this worthy cause, we would love for you to join us. Your company will not be bound by any time constraints of working solely on a Saturday. You may work on the home whenever you wish.




