

From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Parishioners.

Happy New Year! Every new year, many of you may say to yourself the following: I wonder where the time has gone. For me, it seems like yesterday that we were all anxious about Y2K; would our computers work on January 1, 2000, would we be able to get cash from the ATM, or would planes be able to fly because radar systems wouldn't adjust to the new millennium. Now, twenty-two years later, our computers are working fine, hardly anyone uses cash, and air traffic is going fine. Today, we have a whole new set of concerns: what will the next variant of Covid be like or is our personal data safe from hackers; to name just a couple. This is the way that it has always been throughout history. Despite all of this, New Year's always seems to bring with it a sense of optimism and excitement.

None of us knows what the year ahead will place before us: 2020 gave us a real lesson in that. One thing that has been consistent throughout salvation history is the message that was proclaimed in the Scriptures in the days leading up to Christmas, the message that was proclaimed at Christmas and the message that we hear throughout the year: "God is with us". With this reality in mind, in our hearts and in our prayer, we can face any challenge and breathe easier when life seems to be overwhelming to us.

New Year's is a time when many of us make resolutions for the year ahead. In addition to the resolutions to be more attentive to our prayer life, to be kinder to others, to watch our language and to take better care of our health (for example), I encourage each of us to resolve to remind ourselves each day that God is with us. You may wish to do this at the start of the day, as you leave the house, or as you drive (probably especially then), at those moments take a breath and remind yourself that God is with us. I truly believe that the more that we do this, the less stressful life can become. I'm not saying that you will be stress free, but the anxieties of life can be eased by remembering and acknowledging that God is with us.

Now, we begin a New Year. What awaits us? We can only guess, usually what we guess now is not what we recall at the end of the year. The one thing that we can be certain about is that God is with us.

May God's blessings be with you for a wonderful New Year.

Bless Your Door on Epiphany

The Gospel tells us that the Magi found Christ "on entering the house." The door to your home is a holy threshold. You can bless those who come in and go out by inscribing above the door in chalk the first two numbers of the year+C+M+B+the last two numbers of the year. Tradition tells us that the letters stand for the names of the magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. Adolph Adam points out that it may also mean "Christus mansionem benedicat" or "May Christ bless this dwelling." It's appropriate to bless your door in January—janua means "door" and the first month is the door to the new year.

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, we will not be providing chalk that has been blessed to you this year. Chalk purchased from the store or even chalk left over from previous blessing years will be sufficient.

Suggested Blessing for the Home on Epiphany

- * The members of the household gather at the main door to the home.
- * Read the story of the Magi from Matthew's Gospel Chapter 2, verses 1-12.
- * Inscribe 20+C+M+B+22 above the door with chalk.
- * Pray the following blessing prayer:

God of Bethlehem and Cana, God of Jordan's leaping waters, in baptism you bring us into your family. You wed us and embrace us as your beloved. May we fill this place with kindness to one another, with hospitality to guest, and with abundant care for every stranger. By the gentle light of a star, guide home all who seek you on paths of faith, hope and love. Then we will join the angels in proclaiming your praise: Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and for ever. Amen.

* Conclude with a song such as "We Three Kings" or "O Come All Ye Faithful."




