

From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Parishioners.

I'm sure that you noticed last week that I was the only one processing in at Mass. This was done in response to a memo that Archbishop Blair recently sent to the priests of the Archdiocese with new Covid protocols that he would like us to follow at this time. Archbishop has asked that we "refrain from unnecessary circulation in church, from processions, and from greeting or gathering people before or after Mass". It is not mentioned in the memo, but I'm sure this request is just while we are inside the church itself.

Archbishop Blair has also directed that anyone who in unvaccinated "should not be present in the sacristy, sanctuary, or distributing Holy Communion". All Lectors and Extra-Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion have been contacted regarding this. Those who are distributing Holy Communion are still required to sanitize our hands before distributing Holy Communion and after distributing Holy Communion to those who receive on the tongue.

Last weekend, you noticed, as well, that we did not have a choir at Mass. Prior to this memo I met with our Music Director, Emily Phillips, and we had agreed that given the high positivity rate in Connecticut, it would be best if we suspend having the choir until we feel comfortable bringing the choir back. The memo that I received from Archbishop Blair encourages this as well and asks that the Cantor remain masked while singing; this is why the Cantor was masked this past weekend. We will continue in this regard, as with the choir, until the Covid situation improves.

I very pleased with the numbers of people who have decided to wear a mask while in church. As I've said before, and most likely will say again. I, along with most of us, don't care to wear a mask and greatly look forward to when this is no longer recommended. Until that time comes, let's do our best to keep ourselves and others as safe as we possibly can.

I hope that after last week's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord that if you didn't know the date or your Baptism that you became curious to know that date so that you could celebrate it in the future. I did have one person who came up to me after Mass last weekend with the answer to the name of the famous person who died on the day that I was Baptized. That person was: Marilyn Monroe.


Our Father,


