

Saint Joseph Music Notes



The old liturgical calendar of 1962 recognized this Sunday as the Octave Sunday of Epiphany, in which we continue to celebrate the same feast as last week; while our current liturgical calendar of 1968 removed the practice of celebrating octave days, we still in many ways are continuing the celebration today. If Epiphany is the celebration of Christ's first revelation to the Gentiles, beginning with the wise men, His baptism is a celebration of the first revelation of His glory to all men. Because of this connection, many of the hymns we sing today speak of both events almost in the same breath--our Offertory hymn which speaks of the Magi in the first verse touches upon the Baptism almost immediately after in the second verse, and our Communion hymn relates to the Communion antiphon chanted today: "As for all of you who have been baptised in Christ, you have put on Christ, Alleluia."

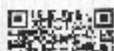
