

We provide affordable household furnishings so that homes can be pleasant places to live, regardless of one's income. Maria and I share a passion for the education, formation, and transformation of the lives of our parishioners – young, old, and in-between. We are also so thankful for **Claire Anderson**, whose ministry of service is in the Faith Formation Office.

I am especially grateful to **Fr. Harry Prieto** and **Deacon Bill Timmel** who are a tremendous help to me liturgically and pastorally. Moreover, I thank all for your prayers and support.

ST. JOSEPH RESPECT LIFE GROUP BEGINS

Mission Statement: The St. Joseph Respect Life Group is dedicated to heightening the awareness of the Respect Life movement within the parish. The group endeavors to build a **Culture of Life** through **Prayer**, (personal, group, national); **Education**, (timely topics and Catholic teachings); **Discussion**, (USCCB Respect Life Program, social issues); and **Advocacy**, (legislation, witness and service).

In our 2022-23 year sessions, we continued our prayer service and self education by studying the works of various Catholic scholars. A major accomplishment was reading Donald H. Calloway's "Consecration to St. Joseph, The Wonders Of Our Spiritual Father". We followed the 33 Day Preparation, and upon completion, we consecrated ourselves to St. Joseph on an individual basis. We also studied and shared our study of Dr. Erik Erikson's seven stages of a person's personality and character development from birth to adulthood.

In January we began our annual Spiritual Adoption Program. We also participated in the parish's Ministry Fair and gained two new members.

One member participated in the March of Life endeavors in Washington, D.C. and Hartford, CT. Another member continued to keep the group informed regarding Federal and State legislation.

During the year we continued to write weekly pro-life reflections found in the parish bulletin regarding abortion, euthanasia, assisted suicide, human trafficking and the need to assist Mothers in Need and other topics.

In this 2023-24 year session, we will add two new endeavors. We will hold a pro-life rosary session in January 2024 at the St. Mary grotto and begin a Question and Answer bulletin piece once a month.
