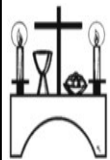

Dear parishioners and friends of St. Joseph Parish,

St. Joseph's part in the story of our Savior's birth is often overlooked. In St. Luke's Gospel, it is written:

And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the City of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. (Lk 2:4-5)

This Bible passage is a reminder that the birth of Jesus is a story about people who were invited to be part of salvation history. They were invited not because of what they did or how important they were; they were invited as ordinary persons. Joseph the carpenter was far away from his tools and his work when Jesus was born. He did not even have to build the manger.

You and I are invited to also be part of the Christmas story and the Lord's life. It may be difficult to believe that we are part of the Lord's life not because of what we do, but rather for who we are. We are the Lord's. God made us, and it is God's love which sustains us.

The **Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas)** which will be celebrated beginning with the **4:00 PM Vigil Mass on Tuesday, Dec. 24**. Our complete Christmas schedule is included following my letter. Christmas, of course, is not a day but a season, and the Christmas season extends liturgically until **Sunday, January 12, 2025**, which is the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**.

This Christmas, may we allow the love of Jesus to touch our hearts so that we may be transformed by it and grow in spiritual maturity as servant leaders in the Church. Please be assured of my profound gratitude for your ongoing commitment to St. Joseph Church. Your friendship and gracious support enables us to fulfill the mission of this historic Danbury Parish. Father Harry Prieto, Deacon Bill Timmel, the Parish staff and I hope that this Christmas will be the most joyous Christmas you have experienced as disciples of Christ, alive in His Spirit.

ANNUAL PARISH COLLECTION

To Date: \$13,404.00 (67%) of our goal of \$20,000

The Annual Parish Collection provides a means to fund designated projects during the current fiscal year. This year's funds are earmarked to refresh the main entrance narthex or vestibule at the front of the Church. The vestibule doors need restoration; the tile flooring is worn and in need of replacement; the wood framing of those memorialized for the 1974 renovation; and the entire space needs repainting. Areas of the Church Hall will also need to be repainted after the stained-glass frames are remade, which have rotted due to aging.

WEEKDAY MASS DURING WINTER STORMS

Please note that, when school is closed due to a substantial winter storm, for everyone's safety, the Church will be closed and Mass will be offered privately.



To celebrate Christmas, a candy maker decided to make a candy that would include several symbols of the life of Jesus Christ, so he made the Christmas Candy Cane.

He began with a stick of pure white, solid candy; white to symbolize the Virgin birth and solid to symbolize the firm love Jesus has for all of us.

The candy maker made the candy in the shape of a "J" to represent the precious name of Jesus.

Thinking that the candy was somewhat plain, the candy maker added red stripes. He used three small stripes to represent the nails that held Jesus on the cross and a large stripe to show the blood shed by Jesus, giving us the promise of eternal life. Then he added the wonderful flavor of peppermint which is a royal gift of spice.

So perhaps the next time you look at this familiar Christmas decoration you will remember the candy maker and the real meaning behind the Christmas Candy Cane: ***The Wondrous Birth of Jesus and His Great Love for all of us.***
