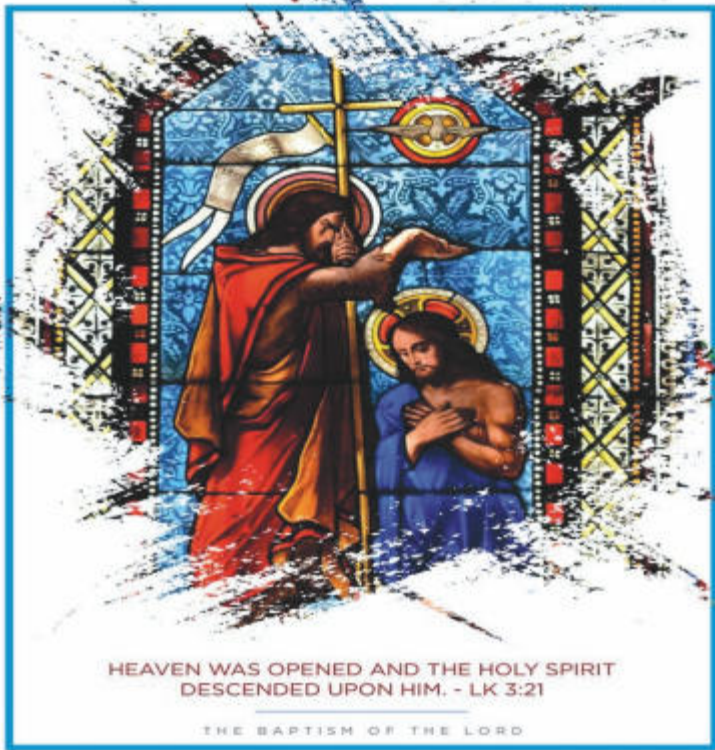

The Baptism of the Lord, Lectionary: 21

READING 1 **IS 42:1-4, 6-7**

Thus says the LORD: Here is My servant whom I uphold, My chosen one with whom I am pleased, upon whom I have put My spirit; He shall bring forth justice to the nations, not crying out, not shouting, not making His voice heard in the street; a bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick He shall not quench, until He establishes justice on the earth; the coastlands will wait for His teaching.

I, the LORD, have called you for the victory of justice, I have grasped you by the hand; I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness.

READING 2 **ACTS 10:34-38**

Peter proceeded to speak to those gathered in the house of Cornelius, saying: "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears Him and acts uprightly is acceptable to Him. You know the word that He sent to the Israelites as He proclaimed peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all, what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him."

GOSPEL **LK 3:15-16, 21-22**

The people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but One mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of His sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are My beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."



Low-Gluten Communion Hosts

The low-gluten hosts need to be refrigerated and therefore can not remain consecrated and in our tabernacle after the weekend Masses. Therefore - we need an accurate count of how many hosts will be needed at any given Mass. To obtain a low-gluten host please take the following steps at one of our weekend Masses:

1. Arrive **at least** 5 minutes before the Mass begins.
2. Go to the Sacristy, which is located in the side room to the front/left if you are facing the altar.
3. Ask the sacristan, deacon or priest in the sacristy for a low-gluten host from the sacristy refrigerator.
4. Take your host to the table in the center of the aisle where the gifts are brought forward during Mass. Place your low-gluten host in the small bowl (ciborium) that is attached to the larger bowl (ciborium).
5. During the distribution of Holy Communion the priest will be in the center aisle. Please get into the line of the priest that celebrated the Mass. He will have your low-gluten host attached to his main bowl (ciborium).
6. When you come to him in line please remind him that you need the low-gluten host.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The Baptism of the Lord, January 9, 2022

“We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ.”

Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

Godparent/Sponsor

To receive a *Letter of Eligibility*, from our parish, a person must be a registered member of our parish for 6 months and be a Catholic in good standing. The guidelines are set by the Archdiocese regarding the requirements that must be met for someone to be accepted as a valid godparent/sponsor.

- A person must be at least 16 years of age.
- Be neither the father nor the mother of the child.
- Have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.
- Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, receive the sacraments regularly and strive to live an active Christian life.
- If married ~ must be validly married within the laws of the church.

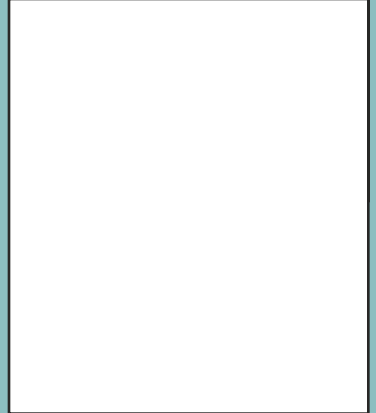

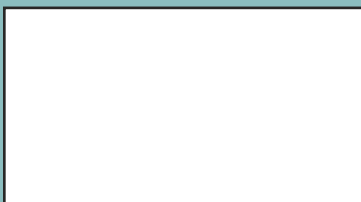

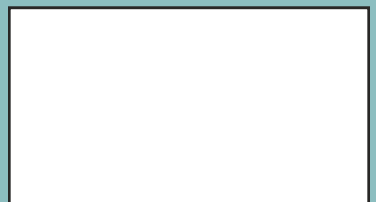
