The Solemnity of the Annunciation celebrates the coming of the Angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to announce to her the special mission God had chosen for her in being the mother of His only son. The feast of the Annunciation, now recognized as a solemnity, was first celebrated in the fourth or fifth century. Its central focus is the Incarnation: God has become one of us. From all eternity God had decided that the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity should become human. Now, as Luke 1:26-38 tells us, the decision is being realized. The Godman embraces all humanity, indeed all creation, to bring it to God in one great act of love. Because human beings have rejected God, Jesus will accept a life of suffering and an agonizing death: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13).

We are continually reminded of the importance of this feast to our salvation in various devotional prayers. Two examples that highlight the importance of this feast are the joyous mysteries of the Rosary and the Angelus. Mary has an important role to play in God's plan. From all eternity, God destined her to be the mother of Jesus and closely related to him in the creation and redemption of the world. We could say that God's decrees of creation and redemption are joined in the decree of Incarnation. Because Mary is God's instrument in the Incarnation, she has a role to play with Jesus in creation and redemption. It is a God-given role. It is God's grace from beginning to end. Mary becomes the eminent figure she is only by God's grace. She is the empty space where God could act. Everything she is she owes to the Trinity. Mary is the virgin-mother who fulfills Isaiah 7:14 in a way that Isaiah could not have imagined. She is united with her son in carrying out the will of God (Psalm 40:8-9; Hebrews 10:7-9; Luke 1:38).

Together with Jesus, the privileged and graced Mary is the link between heaven and earth. She is the human being who best, after Jesus, exemplifies the possibilities of human existence. She received into her lowliness the infinite love of God. She shows how an ordinary human being can reflect God in the ordinary circumstances of life. She exemplifies what the Church and every member of the Church is meant to become. She is the ultimate product of the creative and redemptive power of God. She manifests what the Incarnation is meant to accomplish for all of us.



Here are the Church regulations for fasting and abstinence during Lent:

This Photo by Everyone 14 + is bound to abstain from meat all the Fridays of Lent\* and Good Friday. Everyone 18 and under 59 years of age, is bound to fast on Good Friday. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

Some times it seemed to be hard; it might mean having to forgo a social engagement, or rise an hour earlier, but on the whole it has never been a burden, only a joy. I do not mean to say that all the Holy Hours have been edifying, as for example, the one in the church of St. Roch in Paris. I entered the church about three o'clock in the afternoon, knowing that I had to catch a train for Lourdes two

hours later. There are only about ten days a year in which I can sleep in the daytime; this was one. I knelt down and said a prayer of adoration, and then sat up to meditate and immediately went to sleep. I woke up exactly at the end of one hour. I said to the Good Lord: 'Have I made a Holy Hour?' I thought his angel said: 'Well, that's the way the Apostles made their first Holy Hour in the Garden, but don't do it again.'" - Archbishop Fulton Sheen (Treasure in Clay)

## TEEN EMOTIONAL SUPPORT - SUICIDE PREVENTION:

It is unthinkable that a teen might consider killing themselves, it is hard to have to talk about suicide, It's important for you to have an open line of communication with them and build a sense of trust. When your children are

having difficulties, you want them to feel comfortable turning to you for help. Just as important, is the ability to identify when your kids are struggling emotionally. Children tend to internalize their feelings. If something is troubling them, they may not speak up and ask for support. The following tips can be helpful in starting a conversation and understanding what's going on in their lives.

### Teen Suicide is Preventable

Teen suicide is a serious problem. But there are signs to watch for, and sources for help. Teen suicide is a growing health concern. It is the second-leading cause of death for young people ages 15 to 24, surpassed only by accidents, according to the U.S. Center for Disease Control and Prevention. The COVID pandemic has increased the incident of teen suicide. The risk for suicide frequently occurs in combination with external circumstances that seem to overwhelm at-risk teens who are unable to cope with the challenges of adolescence because of predisposing vulnerabilities.

Suicide is a relatively rare event and it is difficult to accurately predict which persons with these risk factors will ultimately commit suicide. However, there are some possible warning signs such as:

**Talking about dying:** Any mention of dying, disappearing, jumping, shooting oneself or other types of self harm. **Recent loss:** Through death, divorce, separation, broken relationship, self-confidence, self-esteem, loss of interest in friends, hobbies or activities previously enjoyed. **Change in personality:** Sad, withdrawn, irritable, anxious, tired, indecisive, apathetic. **Change in behavior:** Can't concentrate on school, work or routine tasks. **Change in sleep patterns:** Insomnia, often with early waking or oversleeping, or nightmares. **Change in eating habits:** Loss of appetite, weight, overeating. **Fear of losing control:** Acting erratically, harming self / others. **Low self esteem:** Feeling worthless, shame, overwhelming guilt, self-hatred, "everyone would be better off without me." **No hope for the future:** Believing things will never get better, or that nothing will ever change.

**EMOTIONAL SUPPORT** Getting your kids to open up and talk to you can feel like a challenge. The following tips can be helpful in starting a conversation and understanding what's going on in their lives.

**Make them feel safe:** It is essential to make it clear why you are talking with them not at them Kids especially are fearful that they may be in trouble or are being punished. **Listen to them:** Take the time to actively listen to what your kid or teen has to say. Many times, all kids or teens want is someone who will listen to them. **Affirm and support their need for help** If a child tells you they're feeling sad or upset, for example, tell them you're proud of them for sharing their feelings. If your child seems to need more help than you can provide, consult with an appropriate professional. **Be genuine** Try to avoid speaking from a script. Teens can tell when you're not being genuine. If you are open, authentic and relaxed, it will help them to be the same. **Don't be afraid to say I don't know** As a parent or teacher, it is OK to admit that you don't have all the answers. However, if a kid or teen asks you something, you should make every effort to find an answer or someone who can help.
