



How does your garden grow?

My family has gardens. Gardens circling a pond 25 years in diameter, and snaking gardens around the house and ones around a back patio.

We have gardens but it is organized by one mind. My parents had two coffee cups with German inscriptions- "uber gartner" - for my mother- the "over -gardener, and my father's cup- unter gartener- "under gardener". I was a strong healthy back to move rocks- so many Connecticut rocks.

It being Spring I got talking with my mother about the gardens- she can't get out anymore. But her vision is clear of what a garden should be. We talked about the challenge of coming from the Illinois black rich topsoil to Connecticut clay and stone. For a couple years my Mom had manure brought in from farms to spread in the beds she prepared. Once invested in the gardens would reveal the goodness of creation. The natural world is diverse, and developments come in waves. You want to mix and match so that with each time there is something blooming in each part.

She explained succession of flowers is the following:

- First the yellows of Daffodils and Forsythia (with crocuses) in the early Spring
- Then the flowering bushes- Rhododendrons, Dogwood and Azaleas with tulips below
- Then the rushes around the pond like flags and Irises. Also, the "tender plants who winter in-doors come out.
- Then the peonies and roses- who are distinct cases- ants working to open the peonies, and roses flourishing precisely because they had been cut back in the fall.
- Annuals fill out the gardens filling in the spaces and timing the perennials don't cover.
- Finally, the hardy Mums finish off the fall.

She reminded me that every year 20-30 % of a garden needs to be replaced, transplanted, torn out or replanted.

It made me think of the Church more specifically. There is one gardener- Mary Magdalene mistakes Jesus for a gardener on Easter morning. He is the Uber Gartener. He has a vision how each of the varied plants will bloom in its own time.

We are all meant to bloom- our gift shouldn't be put under a bushel basket. But each of us in our own way.

- Are we at a place that we need some fertilizer- should we be looking to learn more to deepen our faith, confront our questions?
- Are we robust early bloomers when it is still frosty?
- Are we blossoming trees always growing in new ways each year?
- Are we faithful tulips blooming inside the same ministry year to year?

- Are we roses that need to be pruned in order to flower- cutting back commitments to create room for growth?
- Are we peonies who flower best when folks around us are purposeful and busy like ants encouraging us to flower as well?
- What is the 20-30% change that we have to face this year? How many new ministries, new activities do we have to be about this year?

As announced last week, all our parishioners are invited to the consecration of the Chrism and the blessing of the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of the Catechumens at the Chrism Mass on Tuesday, April 12, 2022, at 10:30 a.m. The Mass will be celebrated at the Cathedral of Saint Patrick in Norwich. Bishop Michael R. Cote will celebrate

this liturgy. All are invited.

The Sacred Chrism, oil mixed with sweet perfume, symbolizes the presence of the Holy Spirit. It will be used in the parishes of the Diocese of Norwich in the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. It is also used at the Ordination of Bishops and Priests and at the Dedication of a Church and altar. The Oil of the Sick is used to anoint those who are suffering from illness so that they may receive strength and healing, both physical and spiritual. The catechumens will be anointed with the Oil of Catechumens in preparation for their Baptism at the Easter Vigil. The Chrism Mass is a celebration of the entire local Church, and the subsequent use of the oils in the various parishes is a sign of unity among God's people.
