
Baptisms: Twice a month at 1:30 pm for registered parishioners. Instruction for parents is required. Arrangements must be made in advance.

### **Divine Mercy 2022**

It is one week since Easter. It is the Octave of the great feast. During the octave we celebrate it as if it was one continuous day. We are encouraged to take our time and not move on too quickly. We round out the feast with the celebration of God's Mercy.

In the image we see Jesus resurrected with the wounds in his hands and feet. We see Him shining and covered with glory. The image comes with a subtitle-

"Jesus, I trust in you."

The Risen Christ invites us to trust in Him. In the Gospel we meet St. Thomas who missed the gathering on Easter itself. And he missed seeing the Risen Christ. (Note to self don't miss Mass). Thomas has lost his trust. He doesn't trust the message of his fellow apostles. He lost his trust in them and the whole world who took his leader, the one he imitated (his name Thomas means twin but we don't know of his brothers). Jesus was nailed to a cross; he was broken on the cross and taken down placed in a cold dark tomb. He doesn't trust the world that would do that, doesn't trust a God who would allow that, doesn't trust himself for his cowardice when he could have done something. He won't believe until he can touch the wounds, anything less is telling fairy tales. Jesus appears with wounds for all to see. It opens the door to Thomas to profess- "My Lord and my God". He has had his faith and trust restored.

In the image of Divine Mercy there are beams of light shining forth from the heart of Jesus. They are of two different colors: red and white. The original seer Sr. Faustina, explained the beams in this manner. The White represents the grace that makes us righteous. The red represents the new life we are given to lead. The white is the water flowing from the side of Christ that washes us clean. The Red is the life's blood that pumped through Jesus and now would be our life's blood.

To be washed clean is a joy. We trust Jesus in baptism and in Confession to make us clean and unstained. Everyone who meets the risen Lord is offered a chance to be cleansed. That clean fresh feeling makes for joy and peace. The Apostles the first night of Easter were given peace and were made clean by the Lord.

The Red beams of the life's blood is something more. It is when the trust is so full that we let Him live through us. The Apostles were behind locked door the second Sunday. The trust was incomplete. After baptism we have to learn to live the faith. After Confession we go in peace- not just cleansed but reconciled. We trust the Lord when we allow Him to handle all our affairs particularly our temptations and habitual faults. Too often we don't trust the Lord with our worst-the things that might stain us. Yet Jesus gives himself to us, soul and divinity- in communion, in Confession, in our daily prayer.

Easter gets deeper with each hour. We are drawn to trust Him more and more; no matter what wounds the world offersno how much we are afraid to fail. The deeper we dig the more we see just how much He forgives and just how much He longs to enter our lives.
