



May 15, 2022

Today's Gospel takes place at the end of the Last Supper. Jesus has given them His Body and Blood. He washed their feet. Judas gets up without waiting and he leaves. He didn't want to wait until the final blessing. He is going to get out of the parking lot early. Don't be Judas.

After foreshadowing the triumph of the Cross Jesus hands down a new commandment: "Love one another. "To move past acquaintances, more than doing no harm to love and befriend someone is an awesome grace. It changes everything.

I went to Colby College for my undergraduate degree. It is a small school in the middle of Maine. My first semester was challenging. The academic requirements were so far beyond anything I had faced before. I was stunned to get C's on my first tests and essays. Likewise, I hadn't found my feet yet socially. In October I even talk to my parents that I was thinking about transferring. Things changed. I came home for Thanksgiving.

My parents and sister teased me about being breathless in describing my friends. "Greg has Dad jokes but he is carrying 26 credit hours and acing them all. Jim has a super dry sense of humor, maybe a little sly but hilarious. Paul tells stories about grand attempts and grand failures. Tom is impish and funny, really good student. Laurie is a petite blond with an infectious giggle. Toots is down to earth and she could run an old west saloon." I was nicknamed "Harvey Milquetoast because I always let others order before me at the Pub. To love someone is have the details of their life come alive for us. And we in turn allow people to see our self in a way that they can get a grip on us.

I started getting A's the second semester- some because I figured out the demands and the study patterns required. But having a community of friends made me stronger to do my best freely. I have lived oversea a certain number of times, starting as a child. When it is not your language and culture friendships come more slowly. But when they do they have particular power. Someone who will listen to you when your ideas have to be filtered with and infants vocabulary. It is intimidating. I have had generous souls who thought it was worth waiting for and they were a gift from God. Helping others to be welcomed and befriended is challenging but soaked in God's grace.

I think a parish ought to be a place where Christ new Commandment is practiced. We do alright in not being hostile and not treating new people as interlopers. I have been told that it has been a hallmark of the parish from the beginning. But it can't just stay still. People who were good Christian friends move on. New people arrive. How do we go about getting to know and be known?

I went to church with my father. We would share what we thought of the Mass. It was a honor to share it with him. He also drove me crazy. None of my friends with catholic. He on the other hand talked with everyone, all the time. If I knew how to drive, I would have left him. But he, of course, was right taking the chance to meet people, to waste the time, to not get out of the parking lot quickly because there were a few more stories out there, these are an apostolic grace- that Judas couldn't understand.






