
SACRAMENTS

Baptisms: Twice a month at 1:30 pm for registered parishioners. Instruction for parents is required. Arrangements must be made in advance.


Marriages: Arrangements must be made at least one year in advance.

Corpus Christi 2022

In St. Francis' time the Council of the Lateran was convened. It took up the pressing issues of the day in the Church. The understanding of the Blessed Sacrament and its care were essential themes. There were abuses to be addressed: priests not celebrating Mass sometimes not even monthly, churches used to store furniture or animals, dirty altar linens and churches not having tabernacles and keeping the Blessed Sacrament in cabinets.

St. Francis was moved by the Council's teaching. The first passage is from the Admonitions. He equates not seeing God in the Blessed Sacrament to those who did not recognize God in Jesus.

Because God is a spirit, therefore it is only by the spirit He can be seen, for "it is the spirit that quickens; the flesh profits nothing." For neither is the Son, inasmuch as He is equal to the Father, seen by any one other than by the Father, other than by the Holy Ghost. Wherefore, all those who saw the Lord Jesus Christ according to humanity and did not see and believe according to the Spirit and the Divinity, that He was the Son of God, were condemned. In like manner, all those who behold the Sacrament of the Body of Christ which is sanctified by the word of the Lord upon the altar by the hands of the priest in the form of bread and wine, and who do not see and believe according to the Spirit and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, are condemned. He the Most High having declared it when He said, "This is My Body, and the Blood of the New Testament," and "he that eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood hath everlasting life."

The following comes from his Letter to All the Faithful.

O humble sublimity! O sublime humility! that the Lord of the universe, God and the Son of God, so humbles Himself that for our salvation He hides Himself under a morsel of bread. Consider, brothers, the humility of God and "pour out your hearts before Him, and be ye humbled that ye may be exalted by Him. Do not therefore keep back anything for yourselves that He may receive you entirely who gives Himself up entirely to you. Here is more spirituality as an echo. God gives Himself humbly, sublimely we should respond in kind.

The folks who have gone to the Eucharistic Revival in Lowell , MA on Saturday will share what they have received on Monday at 6:30pm followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.




CLASP
