




We enter into ordinary time, but is any time so ordinary? And even if we think of it in the more original meaning — ordered time- things being in the right place. These days it is hard to figure out how things fit together.

The good news is that nothing is new. In the Gospel Jesus sets his sights on heading up to Jerusalem. He is clear and determined, his ultimate purpose is now in view. No sooner than he sets out he hits an obstacle. The Samaritans won't let him or the apostles pass precisely because they intend to go to Jerusalem. Now the apostles are in favor of blowing up the problem- make it disappear in one destructive act.

Jesus is clear in his intention of going to Jerusalem but he accepts the fact that he needs to make an adjustment. He chooses to go around. He rejects the solution of making the problem go away by attacking the people who are part of the problem.

Elisha is called by Elijah in the 1st reading. He hears it as a call from God. He knows it doesn't mean just going- it means a sacrifice. That sacrifice will be what is close at hand; the ox and plough make the holocaust- a fully consumed sacrifice- everything is burned up.

We are called in these ordinary times when we know we are headed to a new Jerusalem but are forever running into resistance. Because we are called we know that we will be asked to make sacrifices. We may have to adjust our plans, rein in our desire to attack those who cause us problems. We may have to sacrifice our time in taking a detour to address new demands, new characters, new opportunities. The things we need for the sacrifice will be right at hand. In that sense it will be in God's good Order.
