





Harry Potter doesn't have a prayer: The Harry Potter novels are fiction, obviously. The portal to a magical world wouldn't be somewhere in London. It would be in Florida or California and the gatekeeper would be a giant mouse and a frozen Walt Disney. In the Harry Potter, special people with special bloodlines learn secret spells. Most of the spells are derived from Latin which is easier to come up with than some other secret language. Those who have the special identity or blood line and learn the secret words can manipulate the world around them to achieve their ends. That is not how prayer works.

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples his very own prayer: the Our Father. Then he makes clear that it is not magic. The words of the Our Father does not compel God to do anything. Jesus goes on to teach that the key to prayer is persistence. The parable is perverse in that we are to see ourselves as the neighbor banging on a door in the middle of the night. God is like the reluctant neighbor who tells us go away, not to bother him. God, of course isn't cranky. He doesn't need his beauty sleep each night. But we do need to be persistent.

The reading from Genesis presents a give and take between God and Abraham. It can seem like Abraham needs to haggle with God to bring down the price of the judgement on Sodom and Gomorrah. "A hundred do I hear fifty, do I hear twenty-five, do I hear ten -sold." But the story begins with God wondering if He should let Abraham know what He is thinking. Abraham in the process of his conversation with God gets a sense of how God would have mercy on whole cities because the goodness of a few.

We pray out of where we really are. We are anxious or afraid of the things. It is honest and true to talk with God about it. We can suggest outcomes based on our limited view. Prayer also means to listen. We listen to the Our Father when we pray it and Jesus; mind and heart is sown in us as His words come out of our mouths. But it takes persistence, our minds and heart make room for God's way of thinking and feeling grows in us in stages. Luke ends this section of the Gospel encouraging us that God will not have us knock on His door in vain. "How much more will the Father give his Spirit to those who ask of Him. Prayer in the end is better than magic because it makes us more in the image and likeness of Godholy.

Forgive, O Lord, resignation and disillusionment, But forsake me not when my strength declines.




