


## SACRAMENTS

The High Cost of Living

We are in a time of inflation: gas prices spiked- they have come down a bit but are still higher than the last several years, meat in the form of cold cuts from deli section are obscenely expensive, cars if you can find them are much higher than a year ago. When we think of the cost of living it inspires anxiety perhaps dread.

Behavioral psychologists have discovered the best predictor for people being to adopt better habits: exercise, better diet, church attendance and so forth. Genetics doesn't predict, nor do family structure, not level of intelligence or education. They found that those who look at the cost are more likely to fall off than those who consider the gain. If you think about all the rigmarole involved in going to the gym you will start tapering off. If you think of all the challenges to get the family out of the to church- any unforeseen problem can stop in you tracks. The first reading from Ecclesiastes captures the disillusionment of one who has paid the price of success only to find that it wasn't worth it. It has been all "chase after wind", all in vain. Jesus tells the parable of the rich fool trying to save up his wealth. They are object lessons, a warning.

Those who succeed in taking on new positive habits don't so much think of the cost as they do of the benefit. When I eat right I feel lighter. After I exercise I feel more energized the rest of the day. After going to church I see things in a new way. I have some peace in my struggles. There is a gain to be had in being alive as much as there is a cost of li our homes, those who wait on us in restaurants, co-workers.

What is so good with being alive and human. First we have an innate appetite for prayer. It isn't always easy and you have to make the time to take the time. It is however something we are made for and yields so much more than we could fabricate ourselves talking to ourselves. To be a human being is to be a social being. We are made for each other. The more we connect with the people around us the more alive we are. It can mean investing in family time- the immediate family and those outside our household. It can be remembering the friends who have blessed us and purposefully reach out to them. It can be the sort of courtesy and friendliness to those we meet in the course of business people who serve us. Those in our pew at Mass. 


