

Holy History gets a point of focus when God audaciously picks Abraham and his descendants to receive his revelation. They are His people which means they will be drawn into His holiness.

Jesus inaugurates a new covenant- all the children of Adam can become God's children not just Jews- though Jesus is a Jew and lives that Law as do those who will carry his Gospel forward.

But Jesus points out that something bigger has begun. The prophets point to a distant future when gentiles will join the sons of Abraham. Jesus confirms that the door is open.

As holy history has unwound hostile pagan people have become followers of Christ. The hated Romans have entered in. The Irish, living at the edge of the known world converted in mass. The New World became Catholic from Northern Canadian tribes to all of Latin America. Asia has heard the Gospel and in the Philippines, it is almost taken for granted that everyone is catholic. More likely than not we are children of families whose culture has become Christian and catholic.

We can't coast home on the faith of our ancestors and parents. Jesus tells us that it is "a narrow way". The old jokes goes: "How do you get to Carnegie Hall?" "Practice, practice, practice." The way is narrow because it requires practice. We aren't on the narrow way if we practice only occasionally. The mystery of the sacrifice of the Mass is too rich to only attend occasionally. Likewise, examination of conscience and making use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation draws us forward on a narrower way.

We should find time for personal prayer. Whether it be rosary, the Stations of the Cross, reflection on scripture (Lectio Divino), or quiet time with the Blessed Sacrament. There should be an element of listening- to the mysteries of the rosary, scripture, or observing the wonder of the created world. There should be an element of sharing your own heart and concerns. Finally, there should be some expression of gratitude.

We should also develop practices in terms of serving our neighbors. It might be neighborly help to those who live near us. It might be volunteering at school or in youth sports. It might be helping in the parish: liturgical ministry, crafts, feeding people at Amazing Grace, or through the Share program, or raising food in the garden for St. Vincent De Paul.

All this takes effort- being children of pious grandmothers be they Italian, or Irish, or Filipino, or Latin doesn't get us closer to God. Faith has to be practiced. The more we practice the more awesome we find it is to be God's child. As we practice, the person of Christ becomes more visible and draws us forward. It is the practices of the faith that help those who follow us to understand how they will walk the way. The Knights of Columbus talk about knights being "practical Catholics". We are called to be practical in our faith and become more and more thoroughly children of God. As we practice our faith along the narrow way, we will come to know He who is "The Way". That is a faith worth passing on.






