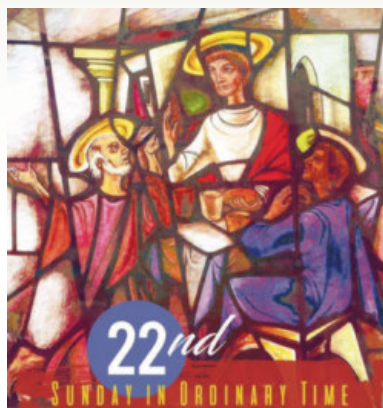
SACRAMENTS

"Tithing—Putting God First" - Stewardship

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you." Luke 14:13-14

One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

Humble is a potent term. St. Francis would say that humility is recognizing who we are in God's sight, no more no less. There is another saying of more recent coinage: "God wants our best not our better than".

Jesus presents a parable about picking seats at a banquet. You can take the seat that is higher than the rest of the guests. Then discover that the host would have you take a lower seat. In turn you could take a lower seat and then be called up higher. We want to be seated where the host would have us. How that relates to the other guests is a by-product.

Sometimes people don't go to the banquet at all. The air of social competition is intimidating. We don't want to find out where we rate, and we sit out the banquet. That isn't real humility. It may be a sort of social reticence. In some way it is a way of taking social dynamics way to seriously. It is 180 degrees from social ambition but equally distorted.

We are moving toward fall and all sorts of things have their beginnings in the parish. We look for people to step up into ministries: liturgical ministries like Ushers, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Altar Servers, Choir Members, also Catechetical Ministries in Faith Formation for children, Rite of Cristian Initiation of Adults, Baptism and Marriage preparation, also Social Activities like helping on the Fair and Auction Committees.

It can feel presumptuous deciding that I will teach others the faith. You go to the head of the class, but real humility allows God to have his way. There is the old saying that you never really know something until you try to teach it. When we offer our time, mix what we know with the course material that is offered present it to young minds and you would be surprised what heights you will reach.

Please consider how God might make use of you. Show up at the banquet and he will find the place for you at the table

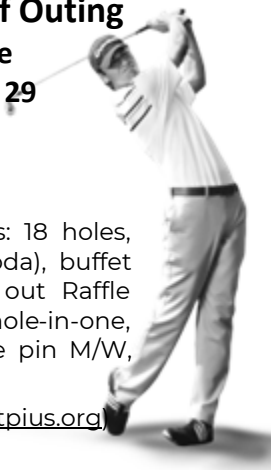
Dear Fr. Martin and the Parishioners of St. Pius X,

Together with the support of St. Pius X parishioners, 2110 pounds of food and products and monetary donations totaling \$1035 were collected. Both are an increase over last year.

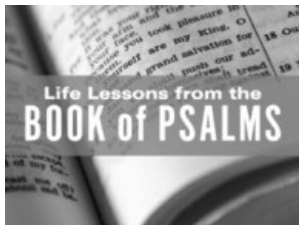
Our Clubs thank you for your community spirit and for making this such a valued event in our calendars. We hope we can collaborate with you next year.
