TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

St. Pius X has a reputation of being a “welcoming” parish. When I speak with newly registering parishioners a fair number if not a majority will mention that spirit of welcome. Not long after I arrived, I had a burial at St. Sebastian’s cemetery and a funeral director clued me in. “St. Pius has always been a bit different. It is not a national parish- you have always taken anyone.” It is a good reputation to have we are welcoming people. Sometimes I wonder though if the bar is pretty low. We are courteous and nice. We do some chatting after Mass outside or in the vestibule and that models a sense of community.

I have been thinking and praying trying to read the signs of the times. The time of the pandemic has had its impact. People have not all come back to being active, practicing Catholics. I think we are down about 20% or so in attendance- and naturally enough also in the collection. A year ago, things were bouncing back, and the curve was trending toward a full return- then new variants appeared and things have leveled off.

I think about Fr. Walter O’Brien OFM Cap, who was the founding pastor of the parish. He didn’t wait for folks to come and then treat them hospitably. He took the initiative and went out to folk’s homes asked people to come. I think it is the season to do more reaching out. There was a poster out when I was in college: there were two vultures on a scraggly dead tree in a desert waste. One says to the other, “Patience my tail feathers. I am going to kill something”. Sometimes we wait for things to ripen and drop from the tree. Sometimes something more proactive is required.

I am going to start keeping a Eucharistic Holy Hour for the parish each week. I also am committing 2-3 hours a week to phone calls and / or face to face meetings. When the angel announces to Mary that she will give birth to the Messiah, the Son of God, he tells her “All things are possible with God”. Then he tells her about her cousin Elizabeth who was thought to be sterile is now with child. Mary is inspired to visit- something amazing has just started to grow in her as she sets out. When Mary greets her the baby in Elizabeth’s womb leaps. What is deep in Mary calls to the best and deepest of Elizabeth and Mary sings her Magnificat of the wonder of the encounter.

Reaching out helps us to come to understand what gifts we have been given deep within. Our reaching out stirs the best within others, maybe spiritual hungers and hidden gifts that ache to be recognized. I think we would do well to have a fair size group committed to visiting first our own parishioners, then see what the Spirit teaches us as to following up.



The St. Pius X Choir Rehearsal

The St. Pius X Choir sings on Sundays at the 10:30 AM Mass and occasionally for other special liturgies. Rehearsals for the autumn, Advent and Christmas seasons have begun on Thursday evenings from 7-8:30 pm in the loft. All interested parishioners of high school age and above are encouraged to join the group and attend rehearsals on Thursdays. New Members are not required to read music but must be able to sing “on key” after some practice. Consider attending a few rehearsals to see if you like it. An audition is not required.
