TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

September 24, 2022

Here it is. On Thursday last week I woke up with pain in my ankle- something like I had had in Early August with the gout. Then I slowly started feeling lightheaded. It was the feast of the Sorrowful Then God's good people called the EMT's. My blood pressure was truly elevated. So they took me away. As they were working on me I could hear the prayers in the church. I went to Middlesex then went on to St. Francis. The blood pressure was not going down and the EKG showed an anomaly that was minor but weren't sure it was chronic or a sign of a recent acute problem. I was observed for a couple days, there wasn't a lot of eating waiting on tests. And sleeping is a little thinner what with regular pokes for blood and squeezes for blood pressure checks, and getting hooked up for EKGs'. In the end they hit on a series of high blood pressures medications. The heart is strong and good, but I don't have to tell you people that.

Obedience and humility go hand and hand. It is hard not to be humble when you have to publicly stop and then get carted away. You don't gain back your pride having to wear an outfit that covers the front but leaves the back open. In medical language they talk about the "compliant" patient. DO you do what the doctor tells you? I heard that in general, 50% of people are fully compliant: taking medicines the way they prescribed, sticking to the recommended diet, going to doctors on a regular schedule. Folks would rather try to gut it out and hope no one notices, or resolve it ourselves without getting anyone else including medical personnel involved. It is a certain sort of pride.

As friars we have not always been the paragons of compliance or obedience, Until the end of the 1980's we did not have centralized medical records. It may seem a bit of a stereotype but as a community of men with no spouses to serve as a sort of healthcare conscience chirping in our ears. We went to doctors inconsistently. And we died earlier that the general male population by 10 years or more. Friars ignored the signs, rubbed some dirt in it, hid their weakness and illness, no one needed to make a fuss. Now we have a healthcare coordinator. We get reminded- maybe harassed to do regular checkups, arrange for new doctors when we move. Now friars live into their 80's with regularity.

I don't know that I can guarantee you that I will be always humble and obedient, hopefully more or less compliant. It is a grace and a gift from God to get past the pride that resists being helped, that rejects sympathy as a form of pity even condescension. But God slowly but surely draws us into a humbling path that is meant to set us free from prayer and become strong enough to receive the help we are offered. May God make us all humble and obedient.
