Sunday October 23 is Ministry Sunday. We lure you downstairs with donuts, because it is part of our holy tradition.

An even deeper part of our holy tradition is to discern our gifts and God's call. Besides the deepest call of our vocations there are temporary calls from God to be his instrument in a particular ministry for a season.

There are opportunities to serve as liturgical minsters: lectors, Eucharistic ministers, choir members, altar servers, ministers of hospitality. Each ministry calls us to give of ourselves- put ourselves out there at the disposal of God. It also is for God to deepen our sense of the liturgy from a particular angle. Many people find something so special in their ministry they do it for years. Even so it is good to get new members of each ministry. Being nervous about responding to the call is right and just- it is a sign that it is important to you.

There are other ministries outside the liturgy. We have folks who minster by cooking for funerals and other events- S.H.A.R.E. and the cooks who do Sunday dinners for St. Vincent De Paul. We have knitters who provide prayer shawls. We have a new group that cleans and dusts the church twice a week. We have a garden club that raises fresh vegetables for St. Vincent De Paul soup kitchen. The Men's club helps with cooking at the Pasta Dinner, the Picnic, the Fall Festival and variety of other events.

Mission Co-Op Appeal—this weekend



The Eucharistic Revival- The Eucharist, did you know?



Why is personal presence different from local and temporal presence? Personal presence often goes beyond the experience of just being with another in a certain place and time. In these two types of presence, our senses are always engaged. But personal presence goes beyond sense perception. When someone lives far away from us or when a loved one dies, for

example, that person can continue to be present with us when we remember the person, recall their words to us, or let the feeling of their presence affect us. Personal presence, because it goes beyond what the senses provide, relies on an inner or spiritual connection and so is most like what we experience in relation to God. This kind of personal connection allows us to have a spiritual experience of God's presence- a presence that goes beyond anything our physical senses can detect. 
