

This week we celebrate All Saints Day and All Souls Day on November 1st and 2nd. It is a wonderful time. To celebrate let's eat candy and dress funny. Actually, the wonder of the time is considering God's delight. God doesn't eat candy, but he has things that he loves.

What God loves is using human beings to bring graces. He makes a universe of wonders and decides to use human beings as his stewards having a dominion to bring out the good of creation. Then when things fall apart through sin God decides to craft redemption. He could have done it by all sorts of manners, but He chose to do it by the Incarnation. The Second Person of the Trinity living a human life- one life to save us all. When Jesus had died and rose God continued to craft salvation through the Church- the Church as a truly human community used by God. Each of us in life represents an opportunity for God to enjoy himself in using our personality and gifts to bless.

All Saints celebrates the undying joy of God in using people. God continues to love human beings as his instrument after death. Each of the saints represents God's joy in using a personality but now free from the constraint of the body. Saints come in all sorts of ways of life or personality types, famous and unknown. We celebrate God's wonderous joy manifest is such an array of people as instruments of grace.

If All Saints is about how Saints living and dead are used by God to bring blessing to us. All Souls is about how God uses us to bring the dead into eternal life. No one gets to heaven on their own merit. Eternal life is God's life- and that life is received as a gift. God gives it through the Body of Christ- the Body of Christ on the Cross washing away our sins, the Body of Christ on the altar the sacrifice that feeds us for the journey from death and life, the body of Body of Christ in the people of God at prayer. God uses us to bring the dead into His light.

It is God's joy that we would be His means of drawing All Souls to himself. It is the reason almost every Mass is for the intention of the dead. It is why the dead are mentioned in the Prayer of the Faithful. We have the honor of asking for mercy for those who in death cannot ask for it. It is our honor to witness to the good of the departed. We recall the ways they were truly children of God in their manner of life. God rejoices to use our prayers for their sake.



The Eucharistic Revival- The Eucharist, did you know?



How is God present to us? God is present to us through both general and particular forms of revelation. We believe that God is present "everywhere" and "always" as the creator and sustainer of our existence. As St. Elizabeth Seton said, "God is everywhere, in the very air I breathe, yes everywhere, but in this sacrament of the altar, God is as present actually and really as my soul within my body; in this sacrifice daily offered, {God is present} as really as {when} once offered on the Cross."

We also believe that God chooses to reveal God's own reality to us through particular created realities, most importantly, through the person of Jesus of Nazareth. Theologian Richard McBrien in his book Catholicism (p.262) explains that "Because God is totally other than we are, because God is totally of the spiritual order, because God, there-

fore, is not visible to our bodily senses, our experience of God is always mediated. We experience the reality of God through our experience of created things, or particular persons, or particular events, or through a psychic sense of divine presence (mysticism). Consequently, every contact with God is mysterious, or sacramental. The hidden God completely permeates a visible reality. 


Prayer Shawl Ministry Gathering
