
SACRAMENTS


Baptisms: Twice a month at 1:30 pm for registered parishioners. Instruction for parents is required. Arrangements must be made in advance.

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

1st Sunday of Advent

How is it that we prepare the way for the Lord? The preparation can reflect our societies values, our own personal tastes or the preferences of God. People decorate their homes- some are subdued a classic almost Victorian look. Others are bursting with all sorts of characters: snowmen with top hats, roly-poly Santas, red-nosed reindeer, full of children's energy and joy. God bless us.

Advent has us dive into the desires of God. How would He decorate our lives? The figure of John the Baptist calls us to repent- put away some of the things that have cluttered our souls to make room for a substantial re-decorating. The prophet calls out for the skies to open to let down the promised one. It all seems so dramatic like the television show: "Extreme Makeover".

It is actually fairly simple: pray and give alms. To expand our prayer life takes a true deliberate sustained choice, it is a big deal in that regard. But a small opening of 20 minutes allows for God to come in and rearrange our interior life. Likewise, a simple, planned gift done in charity has a multiplier effect. Lets look at prayer this week.

For Advent we are adding a variety of moments for prayer. We have Sunday Evening Vespers each week. Vespers is the prayer of the Church- it is made up of psalms, a reading and intercessions. The psalms are the prayer book Jesus himself used so there is a richness in giving ourselves over to them. We will have a night of Taizé prayer- simple chants based on scripture that roll through our mind in a quieting meditative effect. Fr. Ernie will have a class Wednesday nights reflecting on the Sunday Gospels of Advent. Fr. Martin will have reflection and sharing on the Gospel texts on the Incarnation Wednesday mornings at 8:25 before the 9am Mass.

Finally, Advent is a good time to work on your household. People gather the extended family at Christmas. Advent is a good time to sow the seed of people returning to Church. The door gets cracked at Christmas and who knows what graces will make their way into a soul.

It is Advent lets us begin.


