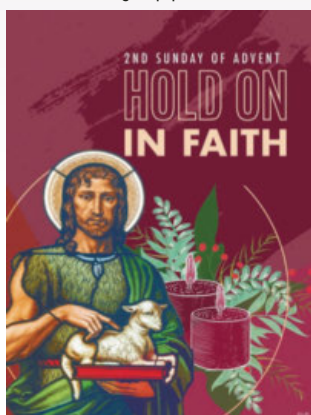

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

2nd Sunday of Advent 2022

Advent is a time of waiting and preparing. What is worth waiting for? What is worth preparing for? Isaiah presents an amazing vision. It comes when the people have been in captivity for a several generations. The vision is almost inconceivable. The lion will lie down with the lamb and the child play at the vipers den, and there is no harm on God's Mountain. Lions and lambs- a lamb would have But God proclaims that this is what is worth waiting for, it is more than your wildest dreams- the whole world turned inside out.

John the Baptist is a herald of a new age. The Messiah is coming and He will turn things on its head. Anyone who eats locust and honey and wears camel skin is clearly signaling something extraordinary. The hope that is worth waiting for has a taste of accountability and fire. How does all this fit together.

The incarnation of God most high draws together the human and the divine - no longer the divine at a distance from what is human, they meet. That they should be bound together is as extraordinary as lions and lamb, children and venomous snakes. Jesus reconciles sinful flesh with God's perfect holiness. As it happened then so it happens now. On the altar all our human life is presented in the gifts of bread and wine and the Holy Spirit comes and consecrates them , transforming them into the Real Presence of Jesus.

We should be awed that the greatest gift is already ours and should never to be missed. But it is not a question of just fulfilling the external of coming to Mass and never missing a week. The gift we receive begs to be lived out, to be bear fruit in our lives. How does the living presence of Jesus that we receive show itself outside of Mass? How are we accountable for the gift of His life, His body and blood?

God the Father arranges for us to live out Christ presence. There are opportunities to be courteous, to be kind, to be a source of encouragement. Even the secular Christmas stories tell us to hope for this. Marylou Who in the simplest of ways innocently talks to the Grinch and his heart grows 10 times larger. Santa invites Rudolph to lead his sleigh with that that red nose of his. Frosty melts and dies but then is risen from the dead. Everything tells us there is something to be hoped for.

The challenges that come in daily life will expose how we need to grow in the gifts of the Spirit. If we are going to help the grinches in our life to get new hearts, if we are going to help our outcast red nosed reindeer discover their power to read, if we are going to help our snowmen rise from the dead, we will need the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Those gifts are: wisdom and knowledge, counsel and understanding, fortitude and piety and fear of the Lord. This is the life of Jesus in human form. This is worth preparing for: asking for the gift as it is in Jesus to come and mix itself in my human life. It is worth waiting for- those gifts tend to grow in us over time.
