

To begin, I wish to thank Bishop McManus for inviting me to share a part of my story with the Missionary Benedictine Sisters in Jinja, Uganda. Also, I wish to thank Father Thomas Landry for his warm welcome to St. Peter's Parish.

HISTORY OF THE MISSIONARY BENEDICTINE SISTERS IN Uwemba, Tanzania

The Missionary Benedictine Sisters and Monks first arrived from Germany, at remote mountainous village of Uwemba in 1936. With only the most basic medications and resources the sisters began to educate the children and address the medical needs of the people. The people accepted the Catholic faith and a large church was constructed. In the past 85 years the sisters have continued to serve the people. The biggest change is that the German missionaries in Uwemba have all died and the Tanzanian Sisters are working tirelessly to carry the tradition of excellence laid by their foremothers. Unfortunately, however, as the old German missionaries died, the support for the mission from the homeland has also faded down to a trickle, making survival of the mission and its ministries a special challenge for the native sisters.

PARTICULAR NEEDS:

Financial support is needed to meet the medical needs of the people.

Financial support is needed to help the sisters assist families stricken by catastrophes.

The cooking-sewing school for young women is in serious need of renovation/upgrading. The buildings need repair.

The funds have primarily gone toward healthcare, and the school has been left lagging.

The orphanage gets no support from the government, therefore, supporting the children is totally on the shoulders of the sisters.

Daily I thank God for the St. Anna's Health Care personnel & their patients & you, my sisters & brothers, as you labor to support your families, yourselves & other causes near to your hearts. I truly thank you for whatever support you may give as you will assist the Missionary Benedictine Sisters carry out their ministry of health care for the very poor in their area. Together, whether we are near or far, we are beautiful sisters & brothers, Gifts from God.
