



Have you celebrated the Sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist, but never got confirmed? Do you want to be a godparent someday to your sibling's or best friend's children? If you answered, "yes", to either question, contact Deacon Vinny at 978-686-4050 or vgat@comcast.net to find out what it takes to be confirmed as an adult. Our next session of classes will be starting at the end of the month.

"Do whatever He tells you."

"Do whatever he tells you" (Jn 2:5). This was Mary's instruction to the servers at the Wedding at Cana and certainly to us today. What Christian would possibly disagree with this instruction at face value? Yet, surely these five words belong in the "easier said than done" category. Just think of some of the things Jesus tells us to do: Do good to those who hate you, pray for those who mistreat you and give to everyone who asks of you (Lk 6:27,30). Forgive without limit (Mt 18:22), make reconciliation with those you've offended (Mt 5:23-24), do not judge others (Mt 7:1), and turn your cheek to those who strike you (Mt 5:39). And let's not forget, deny yourself and take up your cross daily (Lk 9:23), believe in Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist (Jn 6:53-57), and love one another as He loved us (Jn 13:34). I don't know about you, but when reading this incomplete list, there are multiple teachings of Christ that I, at best, fail to do and, at worst, sometimes wish I could ignore.

We know that following Jesus is no easy task. If this were the case, why then did He have to say to His own disciples who were constantly at His side, "Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' but not do what I command?" (Lk 6:46). Few questions can convict the heart of a disciple like this one. So what are we to do, we who want to do whatever Jesus tells us to do, but realize how incredibly difficult it can be at times. I find hope in today's Gospel reading! At the wedding at Cana, the servants must have wondered: who is this man giving them orders, why should they listen to him, and how could following these odd instructions fix the wine shortage? No matter, they still listened to him and did what he said. We on the other hand have been blessed to know exactly who Jesus is, why we should listen to Him, and how following His teachings changes everything. This is why He said to His followers: "I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father" (Jn 15:15). Our faith tells us why we should follow His every word, but we need His help to see it through every day.

Jesus' first miracle of changing water to wine at Cana points to the sacrament of the Eucharist. The grace we receive from Holy Communion will help us to live closer in accordance with Jesus' challenging teachings. In addition, this reading reminds us that we have the support and prayers of our Blessed Mother Mary, who brings our needs to Jesus' attention. The Wedding at Cana is about transformation and when we do what Jesus tells us to do, we are giving Him permission to transform us. As we continue in these early days of the new year, perhaps we could look at Jesus' teachings with fresh eyes to recognize which ones we stumble on or avoid the

most. How transforming could it be if we even just choose one of those teachings as a focus this year and intentionally strived to follow more closely?



inspiring conversation about these disciples, the heroic virtues they lived in the face of prejudice and adversity, and how we can follow their Christian example.






The Gospel of Luke


