


Televised Weekend Mass

Monday, March 14, 7:15 pm



No Strings Attached

And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem (Lk 9:30-31).

Three years ago a friend of mine asked if I would like to join him and a couple of other guys in doing a program called, *Exodus 90*. In case you haven't heard of it, it's an intense 90 day spiritual program for Catholic men. The three-month plan is centered around the reading of the Book of Exodus and the practice of a number of challenging disciplines, including but not limited to fasting, abstaining from alcohol, desserts, snacking, watching tv, social media, secular music, and warm showers. In addition, you are called to pray at least an hour a day. The idea behind the program is that it is meant to help you become aware of your attachments to "earthly things", as Saint Paul called them in today's Second Reading, and lead you to greater freedom in Christ.

I decided to give the program a shot and took part in it with the other guys. One thing that surprised me is that when we met each week to share our individual experiences it was clear that each of us struggled and thrived with different disciplines. For example, one man had no trouble giving up his phone, but really had difficulty making prayer a daily routine, while another already had a strong prayer life, but found it hard to stop snacking. I am in no way promoting or endorsing this program, but simply mentioning it as it reminded me that each one of us has attachments and obstacles to experiencing the freedom to which Jesus is leading us. What may even seem like small attachments can still keep us from truly hearing and completely responding to God's call in our lives. St. John of the Cross taught that just as a bird tied to the thinnest string cannot fly, a soul attached to anything will not attain the freedom of being united with God.

I used to think that freedom and discipline were polar opposites. Perhaps it's because sometimes freedom has been advertised as meaning *you can do whatever you want, when you want.* Unfortunately, that type of lifestyle isn't true freedom, but one very much tied to the ego and our desires. True freedom, as the obedience of faith show us, is being able to love God with our whole selves and love one another like Jesus instructed us to do, *no strings attached.* Healthy and faith-inspired disciplines, fueled by the grace of the Holy Spirit, lead us on the path to freedom.

In today's Gospel story of the Transfiguration, we see Jesus speaking to Moses and Elijah about the "exodus" He was going to accomplish. Moses led the Israelites on the Exodus from slavery in Egypt to the freedom that would eventually lead them to the Promised Land. The exodus that Jesus—through his passion, death and resurrection—offers you and me is from the slavery of sin and death to the ultimate joy and freedom of everlasting life with God. The disciplines of Lent are designed to help us actively take part in the exodus Jesus has accomplished. As we give ourselves to the practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, God is offering us the chance to see more clearly what attachments are holding us back from living the fullness of life God is leading us toward. This is the perfect time to honestly reflect on what earthly things and desires we are holding on to that may get in the way of the true freedom that Jesus wants us to know.


